#### **INVITATION:**

On behalf of the Illinois Department of Public Health's Office of Women's Health and Family Service (OWHFS) and the Illinois Public Health association, we would like to extend an invitation to you to consider registering to attend Illinois' first Maternal Health Summit. The purpose of the Summit is to identify opportunities to improve maternal health, reduce disparities, leverage the expertise of peers, and assist OWHFS in developing a statewide action plan.

Reaching Illinois women and families is at the core of every activity conducted by the OWHFS. The office was established in 1997 and is now one of the largest state offices of its kind in the country. The OWHFS serves the women and families in Illinois in several capacities, some of our activities specific to preventing maternal mortality and morbidity include:

- Regionalized Perinatal Health Care Program: Illinois has a robust perinatal regionalization system that includes 10 Administrative Perinatal Centers (a university, university affiliated hospital or a combination of universities/hospitals, having a Level III Perinatal designation) that supervises 122 obstetric hospitals in Illinois. Through this program, Illinois has helped to provide quality care to perinatal patients in Illinois since the perinatal regionalization system inception in 1976.
- **Family Planning:** The Family Planning Program provides comprehensive information and services (along with related preventative health services) to men and women in order to lower the incidence of unintended pregnancy, improve maternal and infant health, and reduce the incidence of abortion.
- Illinois Perinatal Quality Collaborative (ILPQC): ILPQC works to improve the health of pregnant women, mothers and infants through perinatal quality improvement initiatives implemented by birthing hospitals throughout the state.
- Chicago Department of Public Health (CHPH) Mini-Grant Program: This grant program allows IDPH to reach health care
  providers, community-based organizations, and families in Chicago to ensure access and coordination to high quality health care and
  social services to optimize birth outcomes. Activities include, but are not limited to, improving nurse and support services to strengthen the
  safety net for all mothers and infants while building a system of coordinated referral to needed services in Chicago.
- **WISEWOMAN Program:** This research program, currently being piloted in designated areas of the state, is designed to help women in the Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer program to reduce their risk of heart disease and to promote a heart-healthy lifestyle.
- **Maternal Morbidity and Mortality Report:** This report identifies statewide trends in maternal deaths and provides recommendations to help prevent maternal mortality.

#### **PROGRAM OBJECTIVE:**

To address the gaps in knowledge regarding maternal health, learn and discuss recommendations generated by Illinois' two Maternal Mortality Review Committees (MMRCs) and develop specific strategies and action steps to implement programs and policies that can facilitate better outcomes for women and families across the state of Illinois.
