



All-Star Behavior

What do the colors mean on our class clip chart?


Red- Outstanding! You have gone above and beyond what is expected and you are being a good role model for others.

Yellow - Great job today! You have consistently made great choices throughout the day.

Green - Ready to learn. This is where every student begins, every day. If you stay here, you may have received a few reminders to stay on task, but you had a good day.

Blue - Today is just an okay day and you have been asked to think about your actions and make better choices. You may need to move seats, take an in-class blue pass, or conference with the teacher.

Purple - You've received a consequence that will be determined by the teacher. This could be: losing 5 minutes of recess, conference with the teacher, loss of computer privileges, etc. A parent/guardian may be contacted to discuss behavior.



Students will be rewarded for positive classroom behavior as determined by the team of classroom teachers. These rewards could include extra recess, grade level dress up days, treats, etc.

Please note that we also follow the "Blue Pass, Red Pass" behavior system that is in place for our entire elementary school. Our goal is to manage behavioral issues within the classroom, but sometimes it is necessary for additional intervention.

Blue Pass - At the discretion of the classroom teacher or if a student is on purple on our clip chart system, they will take a blue pass and go to the office to sit for 10 minutes. Their visit will be recorded by the office staff, but a meeting with Mrs. Sneath is not necessary.

Red Pass - When a student's actions require immediate intervention, they will take a red pass and have a conference with Mrs. Sneath. A phone call may be made home to parents by Mrs. Sneath and the student.
