7 **Purpose:** To promote awareness on designated smoking areas according to the
8 campus smoking policy.
- 9 **Whereas:** A number of constituents have complained about smoking in
10 undesignated areas and cigarette butt litter.
- 11 **Whereas:** Smoking is a health hazard to smokers and those around them.
- 12 **Whereas:** As of June 2006, smoking is prohibited inside and in proximity to the
13 designated smoke-free entrances to all College buildings.
- 14 **Whereas:** As of June 2006, faculty, staff, and students who wish smoke can do so
15 outside at the designated smoking areas where proper ash trays exist.
16 These people must properly dispose of the remains in designated
17 receptacles.
- 18 **Whereas:** Many colleges offer smoking cessation programs or counseling groups
19 and ban smoking in all public and indoor areas.
- 20 **Whereas:** In a Harvard research paper, only 4.2% of schools surveyed nationwide
21 allowed for smoking everywhere on campus.
- 22 **Whereas:** Seven colleges in South Carolina have enacted or plan to enact smoke-
23 free campus policies to promote their campus.
- 24 **Whereas:** Restriction of tobacco distribution, prohibition of tobacco sales,
25 restriction of smoking within 20 feet from entrances, and prohibition of
26 smoking in residence halls were not associated with the odds of smoking,

1 suggesting that they are ineffective in influencing college students'
2 smoking behaviors.

3 **Whereas:** There are 25 designated smoking areas across campus, most notably the
4 sheltered areas of interior St. Phillip Garage, Simon Fine Arts Courtyard,
5 Craig, and Physician's Auditorium (left side), but there are none on
6 Wentworth.

7 **Whereas:** There are those students who may be trying to stop smoking on campus,
8 while others begin to smoke more regularly.

9 **Whereas:** Many constituents choose to smoke shortly after class or leaving
10 buildings.

11 **Whereas:** Smoking enforcement has a nonexistent budget.

12 **Whereas:** Public Safety has refused to enforce many parts of this policy

13 **Therefore:** BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT
14 ASSOCIATION IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, THE FOLLOWING:

15 **Section I:** The College of Charleston Student Government Association publicly
16 announces its support for better awareness of the 2009 smoking policy
17 and also to aid Public Safety in promoting better following of the
18 smoking policy through events and public awareness campaigns.

19 **Section II:** The Student Government Association supports Public Safety in
20 reminding those persons who are not in compliance with the College's
21 no smoking policy on the outdoor smoking areas. Any College
22 employees and students also may take the initiative to inform
23 individuals of the outdoor policy and ask for their compliance.
24 Supervisors will instruct their employees in the policy and should they
25 view an employee, whom they supervise, in a non-designated area-will
26 instruct them as to the location of the designated area(s). Employees
27 and students with concerns should follow the appropriate College
28 grievance procedure. Any disruptions related to the smoking
29 regulations should be reported immediately to the Dean of Students

1 when students are involved and to the supervisor when employees are
2 involved.

3 Section III: When enacted, a report shall be made once every two months to the
4 Senate and the Executive Board on news regarding effective
5 enforcement of the smoking policy on campus.

6 Section IV: The Student Government Association is willing to allocate funds from
7 the budget to promote the smoking policy on campus, whether that be
8 through supplying more ash trays on campus or through awareness.

9 Section V: The Student Government Association will work within the limits of
10 the College of Charleston and the City of Charleston's authority and
11 regulations.

12 Section VI: THIS BILL SHALL TAKE EFFECT (UPON PASSAGE) BY THE
13 STUDENT SENATE SITTING IN GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE
14 SIGNATURE OF THE STUDENT BODY PRESIDENT.

Purpose: To amend the Special Rules of the College of Charleston Student Government Association Senate.

Whereas: the current special rules of the Student Government Association Senate state, "All bills and resolutions must be submitted to the President Pro Tempore no later than the Thursday preceding the next full senate meeting."

Whereas: most committees meet on Thursday afternoons leaving no time for legislation to be written for the upcoming week.

Whereas: the current policy of the Student Government Association Vice President is to accept legislation until 7:00 PM on the Friday before the upcoming senate.

Therefore: BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, THE FOLLOWING:

Section I: Strike the section of the Student Government Association Senate special rules under "Setting of the Agenda".

Section II: Replace the struck text with the following bullet points.

- ~~All bills and resolutions must be submitted to the President Pro Tempore no later than the Thursday preceding the next full Senate meeting.~~ All bills and resolutions must be submitted to the Vice President of the Student Government Association or the President Pro Tempore of the Senate if designated by the Vice President by a

1 time to be recommended by the Vice President at the first senate of the fall
2 semester which must be ratified by a 2/3 vote of the student senate.

- 3 • ~~The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall arrange legislation, guest speakers,~~
4 ~~officer reports, and any other business that may be coming before the Senate and~~
5 ~~arrange the material to create an agenda that the Senate shall follow during each~~
6 ~~meeting.~~ The Vice President or the President Pro Tempore of the Senate if
7 designated by the Vice President shall arrange the legislation, guest speakers, officer
8 reports, and any other business that may be coming before the Senate and arrange
9 the material to create an agenda that the Senate shall follow during each meeting.

10 **Section III:** THIS BILL SHALL TAKE EFFECT (UPON PASSAGE) BY THE
11 STUDENT SENATE SITTING IN GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE
12 SIGNATURE OF THE STUDENT BODY PRESIDENT.

10 *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised* shall govern the Senate of the College of Charleston

11 Student Government Association except where it conflicts with Federal or State law, o the

12 Bylaws and Special Rules of the Senate. For the purposes of these Special Rules *Robert's*

13 *Rules of Order, Newly Revised* shall be termed "RONR"

14

15 *Speaking Rights in the Senate*

- 16
- Any student may be recognized and hold the floor in the Student Senate.
- 17 Executive Council members, with the Exception of the Vice President, may be
- 18 recognized and hold the floor in senate, however they do not have floor rights and
- 19 shall not make motions or have the right to vote. Floor rights, the right to make
- 20 motions are held by student Senators.
- Any speaker who has obtained the floor by recognition of the presiding officer shall
- 21 have the privilege of yielding the floor to another speaker. However, any speaker
- 22 who has obtained the floor by having it yielded to him/her shall not have the
- 23 privilege of yielding the floor to anyone else.
- 24

25

26 *Setting of the Agenda*

- 1 • All bills and resolutions must be submitted to the President Pro Tempore no later
2 than the Thursday preceding the next full Senate meeting.
- 3 • The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall arrange legislation, guest speakers,
4 officer reports, and any other business that may be coming before the Senate and
5 arrange the material to create an agenda that the Senate shall follow during each
6 meeting.

7

8 *The Keeping of a Speaker's List*

- 9 • There shall be a speaker's list, which shall be kept by the Parliamentarian. The
10 President of the Senate shall call on members in the order that they appear on the
11 speaker's list. The Parliamentarian shall record the names of members in order in
12 which the members request recognition by the President, and shall place members
13 who have not been recognized during the current period of discussion or debate
14 above members who have spoken, on the speaker's list.

15

16 *Recognition of Points of Personal Privilege*

- 17 • Senators wishing to leave during a Senate meeting shall first be acknowledged for a
18 point of personal privilege by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Senator
19 may seek recognition by holding a sign or through other nonverbal means.

20

21 *Differences in Debate from Normal Procedure*

- 22 1. When the agenda calls for a piece of legislation to be brought before the Senate,
23 the President of the Senate shall call recognize the presenter of the legislation and
24 shall ask the presenter to read the bill to assembly before giving the present the
25 floor.
- 26 2. When the presenter(s) of a bill is given the floor by the President of the Senate, the
27 presenter may speak for two minutes total (unless the Senate extends the time
28 allowed by a vote or general consent) to introduce their legislation. No member
29 may interrupt the speaker except for motions that are able to interrupt per RONR.

- 1 3. When the time for introduction has expired, the assembly shall move into a period
2 of “Discussion.” This period shall last five minutes, unless changed by a majority
3 vote of the Senate or by general consent. Once recognized by the President of the
4 Senate, members may ask questions of the Present. The President of the Senate
5 shall be careful not to allow questions phrased to be persuasive or debating about
6 the legislation. There shall be no debate in the period of “Discussion.”
- 7 4. After the period of discussion has ended, the Senate shall move on to a period of
8 debate. This period shall last five minutes, unless changed by a majority vote of the
9 Senate, or by general consent. The President of the Senate Shall recognize
10 members for speeches in favor and in opposition to the legislation alternatively.
11 Members shall designate the purpose of their speech by either raising an open hand
12 to express a speech in favor of the legislation or by raising a closed fist to signify a
13 speech in opposition to it.
- 14 5. After the time period of debate has ended, the presenter may be given his/her last
15 rights of speech, which shall last for two minutes (unless changed by a majority vote
16 of the senate or general consent). No member may interrupt the speaker except for
17 motions that are able to interrupt per RONR.
- 18 6. After the period of time allotted for the presenter’s last rights has expired the
19 President of the Senate shall instruct the presenter to re-read the motion. Once the
20 motion has been read the Senate shall be in line to vote on the legislation.

21
22 *Differences in Voting from Normal Procedure*

- 23 • The President of the Senate, or any member of the Senate may call for a vote to be
24 taken by either a standing or roll call vote prior to the vote being taken. If there is
25 no request for the vote to be taken by other means, then the vote shall be taken by
26 a voice vote. Division can be called by any Senator after a voice vote and, if five
27 senators rise in support of the call for division, the vote shall be retaken by standing
28 vote.

1 *Unanimous Consent and Unanimous Proclamation*

- 2 • A member may move to pass a motion by “Unanimous consent” in order to
3 expedite the hearing of an uncontroversial piece of legislation. This motion may
4 only be made during a period of discussion. The motion must be seconded, is not
5 debatable, and shall fail if there are any objections. If the motion pass than the
6 legislation shall have passed, and the Senate shall proceed to the next order of
7 business.
- 8 • A member may move to pass a motion by “Unanimous Proclamation” in order to
9 show a particularly enthusiastic vote in favor of the legislation. This motion may
10 only be made during the period of debate on a speech in favor of the legislation.
11 The motion must be seconded, is not debatable, and shall fail if there are any
12 objections. If the motion pass than the legislation shall have passed, and the
13 Senate shall proceed to the next order of business.

14
15 *Differences in Voting from Normal Procedure*

- 16 1. Senators may make friendly amendments to a main motion during a period of
17 discussion. The Senator making the friendly amendment upon being recognized by
18 the President of the Senate, shall ask the presenter of the motion if that member
19 agrees to the friendly amendment. If the member agrees to the amendment the
20 main motion shall proceed as amended.
- 21 2. All amendments, whether friendly or not, must be submitted in writing to the
22 President Pro Tempore. Friendly amendments may be submitted after it has been
23 made. Regular amendments must be submitted prior to the Senator being
24 recognized to bring the amendment to the floor.

25
26 *Tabled Legislation*

- 27 • Legislation that is “Laid on the Table” shall be automatically be brought up in
28 Unfinished business for the following two senate meetings. If, after the second
29 Senate meeting in unfinished business, the legislation remains on the table the
30 motion shall be considered withdrawn and may not be brought back before the

1 Senate. A motion to lay on the table shall require a second and a majority vote of
2 the Senate and shall not be debatable.

- 3 • Any motion may be withdrawn before being amended or before a vote has taken.

4

5 *Time of Senate Meetings*

- 6 • The College of Charleston Senate shall, during the regular school session, meet
7 weekly at 4:30 PM on Tuesdays.

- 8 • Meetings shall be limited to two-and-a-half hours from the time the meeting is
9 officially called to order. A two-thirds vote of the Senate can allow for a
10 continuance.

11

12 *Suspending and Amending the Special Rules*

- 13 • A two-thirds vote of the Senate may vote to suspend any provision of these special
14 rules that are not outlined in the Bylaws.

- 15 • These special rules may be amended by a three-quarters vote of the Senate. The
16 amendment shall be brought before the Senate as a piece of legislation and shall
17 take effect upon passage by the Senate.

WHEREAS, the Allocations Committee is responsible for distributing approximately \$105,000 each year to on-campus organizations at the College of Charleston.

WHEREAS, there has been a significant increase in the number of organizations requesting funds on campus.

WHEREAS, it is important for organizations to be held financially accountable for their spending.

WHEREAS, a significant number of sanctioned organizations had not spent any money from the Fall 2010 allocated budget.

WHEREAS, these funds could have been used by other organizations that spend their budgets appropriately to help fund more trips, events, and speakers.

WHEREAS, the Treasurer has “the ability to freeze and cut budgets of delinquent organizations as defined by the Compass, with the approval of the Allocations Committee in accordance to section 700.003h.”

WHEREAS, a semester Budget Spending Report from organizations would be a useful resource to the Allocations Committee when deliberating on next semester’s budgets.

1 **WHEREAS**, a semester Budget Spending Report would increase fiscal responsibility for
2 organizations at the College of Charleston.

3 **THEREFORE**, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STUDENT
4 GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, THE
5 FOLLOWING:

6 **SECTION I:** the Student Government Association of the College of Charleston
7 insists upon the revision of the COMPASS during the summer of 2011 to include a
8 Budget Spending Report for all sanctioned organizations with a semester budget of \$500 or
9 over when submitting a budget request.

Purpose: To amend the Bylaws of the Student Government Association.

Whereas, Regular and consistent attendance is critical to the success of the Student Government Senate.

Whereas, It is the duty of a Senator to be present during Senate session, and to have prior permission for all absences.

Whereas, Recent Senate sessions have seen an excessive loss of Senators prior to adjourning.

Whereas, It is the role of a Sergeant-at-Arms to maintain order in the Senate, upon the direction of the Vice-President, and to bar the doors to retain quorum.

Whereas, Lacking a Sergeant-at-Arms, the Vice-President has no ability to enforce order or protect a quorum.

Whereas, The office of Sergeant-at-Arms is a timeless staple of all legislative bodies of note.

Therefore: BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, THE FOLLOWING:

Section I: Add a Section 300.001f, stating, “To direct the actions of the Sergeant-at-Arms and all applicable deputies.”

Section II: Add a Section 303.001, stating “There shall be a Sergeant-at-Arms. The duties of the Sergeant-at-Arms shall be as follows:”

- 1 Section III: Add a Section 303.001a, stating “To maintain order in the Senate, at the
2 direction and discretion of the Vice-President.”
- 3 Section IV: Add a Section 303.001b, stating “To bar the doors to chambers, upon the
4 order of the Vice-President, and restrict the flow of Senators and
5 spectators as directed during times of disorder.”
- 6 Section V: Add a Section 303.001c, stating “To remove spectators from the gallery, at
7 the direction and discretion of the Vice-President.”
- 8 Section VI: Add a Section 303.001d, stating “To work with the Deputy Sergeant-at-
9 Arms to establish and coordinate a schedule to ensure that one
10 representative will be present at all Senate sessions.”
- 11 Section VII: Add a Section 304.001, stating “There shall be two Deputy Sergeant-at-
12 Arms, serving under the Sergeant-at-Arms. The duties of the Deputy
13 Sergeant-at-Arms shall be as follows:”
- 14 Section VIII: Add a Section 304.001a, stating “To abide by the duties established for the
15 Sergeant-at-Arms in Bylaws Sections 303.001, a, b and c.”
- 16 Section IX: Add a Section 304.001b, stating “To adhere to the Senate attendance
17 schedule set by and with the Sergeant-at-Arms.”
- 18 Section X: THIS BILL SHALL TAKE EFFECT (UPON PASSAGE) BY THE
19 STUDENT SENATE SITTING IN GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE
20 SIGNATURE OF THE STUDENT BODY PRESIDENT.
