Whereas, part of Section 1400.003 currently reads, “The Allocations Committee is responsible for determining an organization’s annual operating funds for the next year during budget hearings each spring.”

Whereas, the SGA now has Budget Hearings on a semester basis instead of a yearly basis.

Therefore: BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, THE FOLLOWING:

Section I: Strike the words from Section 1400.003 “annual operating funds for the next year during budget hearings each spring.”

Section II: Insert after “organization’s” in Section 1400.003 “semester operating budget for the upcoming semester during budget hearings each fall and spring.”

Section III: Section 1400.03 will then state, “There shall be an Allocations Committee, to which a maximum of four additional members may be recruited from the student body at large. The Student Life Coordinator for Business Services or his/her designee shall serve as an ex-officio member. Allocations

Committee members are responsible for distributing funds from the contingency fund established each year from the Student Activities monies. The Allocations Committee is responsible for determining an organization's *semester operating budget for the upcoming semester during budget hearings each fall and spring*. During these hearings each committee member shall be present for a substantial number of hours and during the deliberation. The Compass shall guide the manner in which the committee allocates funds to registered and sanctioned organizations. The Committee chairperson shall be the Treasurer of Student Government Association."

Section III: THIS BILL SHALL TAKE EFFECT (UPON PASSAGE) BY THE STUDENT SENATE SITTING IN GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE SIGNATURE OF THE STUDENT BODY PRESIDENT.

21 of Staff, and Deputy Chief of Staff shall nominate students reflecting the
22 campus population and meet with the advisory council once every two
23 months. The President shall provide members of the Student Body
24 President’s Advisory Council with updates from the Board of Trustees.”

1 **Section III:** Strike Section 500.005k, which states, “To co-chair the Student Body
2 President’s Advisory Council and assist in the nomination of students to
3 serve on this board. The Chief of Staff shall also take minutes and create
4 an agenda for the meetings.”

5 **Section IV:** Strike Section 500.012b, which states, “To co-chair the President’s Student
6 Advisory Council with the President of the College of Charleston, as well as
7 create the meeting agenda, appoint members, and provide minutes of the
8 meeting to the President’s office, or find an appropriate representative to
9 fulfill these roles.”

10 **Section V:** THIS BILL SHALL TAKE EFFECT (UPON PASSAGE) BY THE

Purpose, to amend the bylaws of the SGA.

Whereas, according to the Constitution, “The Senate, sitting in General Assembly, shall have the power to... Create or dissolve committees as it sees fit with a two-thirds vote.”

Whereas, several SGA leaders and members have concluded that in its current structure, the Academic Affairs Committee does not address academic concerns as efficiently as it should.

Whereas, certain academic initiatives are difficult to delegate to an entire committee.

Whereas, specific committee requirements, as stated in the bylaws, make it difficult to address academic initiatives on a case-by-case basis.

Whereas, academic concerns would be better addressed through a more streamlined, individual position.

Whereas, this individual would have the flexibility to work on initiatives independently or reach out to other SGA members for support as necessary.

Therefore, BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, THE FOLLOWING:

- 1 **Section I:** The Academic Affairs Committee is hereby dissolved.
- 2 **Section II:** The new position of Academic Affairs Liaison will manage initiatives,
3 communication and projects related to academic affairs, which had
4 previously been the duty of the Academic Affairs Committee.
- 5 **Section III:** Add, and then re-order accordingly, Section 500.007 to state, “To appoint
6 an Academic Affairs Liaison whose duties shall include, but not be limited
7 to, the following:”
- 8 **Section IV:** Add Section 500.007a, which shall state, “To ensure the responsibility for
9 recognizing and meeting the changing academic needs of the Student Body
10 through creation and enactment of viable policy and for maintaining
11 regular communication with the follow: (1) Provost and Executive Vice
12 President for Academic Affairs, (2) Registrar, (3) any academic clubs or
13 organizations, and (4) Speaker of the Faculty Senate.”
- 14 **Section V:** Add Section 500.007b, which shall state, “To serve as a liaison by attending
15 all Faculty Senate meetings and report what was discussed back to SGA
16 Senate and the Executive Board the following week.”
- 17 **Section VI:** Add Section 500.007c, which shall state, “To call upon other SGA
18 members when in need of assistance on projects and initiatives related to
19 academic affairs.”
- 20 **Section VII:** Strike Section 500.010c, which states, “To approve the decisions of the
21 Academic Affairs Committee regarding the selection of students to faculty
22 committees and ensure that they meet regularly with the faculty committee.
23 Members of faculty committees should regularly report on the committee’s
24 work to the Senate.”
- 25 **Section VIII:** Change Section 1305.000a to state, “Advise the Academic Affairs Liaison
26 on issues relating to academic policies, current issues being discussed by the

1 Faculty Senate, and any other information which may be deemed
2 appropriate for the jurisdiction of the liaison.”

3 **Section IX:** Change Section 1305.000b to state, “In conjunction with the Academic
4 Affairs Liaison, represent student concerns and SGA programs and services
5 in the Faculty Senate.”

6 **Section X:** Strike Section 1400.002, which states, “There shall be an Academic Affairs
7 Committee. This committee shall be responsible for recognizing and
8 meeting the changing academic needs of the Student Body through the
9 creation and enactment of viable policy and for maintaining regular
10 communication with the following: 1) Vice President for Academic Affairs,
11 2) Registrar, 3) any academic clubs or organizations, and (4) Speaker of the
12 Faculty Senate. The Committee Chairperson shall be appointed by the
13 Executive Council of the Student Government Association.”

14 **Section XI:** Strike Section 1400.002a, which states, “To appoint faculty committee
15 representatives immediately following the fall elections (or before if there is
16 earlier business in which the Student Government Association should have
17 input) and to maintain contact with the representatives. The representatives
18 shall report to the Chair of the Academic Affairs Committee explaining
19 their progress and any other relevant information, and shall report these
20 findings to Senate when deemed necessary.”

21 **Section XII:** THIS BILL SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN THE SPRING SEMESTER 2012
22 (UPON PASSAGE) BY THE STUDENT SENATE SITTING IN
23 GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE SIGNATURE OF THE STUDENT
24 BODY PRESIDENT.
