Welcome to February!

It is hard to believe that we have passed the mid-point of the school year. Our second trimester comes to a close at the end of this month and along with the end of the trimester are lots of great activities.

We will have minimum days for parent-teacher conferences March 3rd – 6th. Our teachers will be setting up conferences for any new students as well as some continuation conferences from the fall for some students. If you have a need for a conference, please feel free to contact your child's teacher. On-going communication and a partnership with your child's teacher are contributing factors for your child's success in the spring.

GATE- If you are interest in your 4th-6th grade student taking the Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test (NNAT) for possible Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) identification, please email Mrs. Gross at jgross@egusd.net. There is limited testing for students in grades 4- 6 later this spring.

It is SO important that you make sure your child is here EVERY DAY...ALL DAY...ON TIME! One of the most powerful predictors of school success is attendance. Students are expected to be in class ready to learn by 8:00, not running through the gate at 8:00. We often hear, "I'm late because you closed the gate." The gate has nothing to do with if your child is late or on time. Students not in their classroom by 8:00 are sent to the office for a late slip regardless if they made it through the gate or not. Coming in tardy and leaving early both have an enormous impact not just on your child but on every child in the classroom. When children are tardy, their late entrance interrupts instruction. The same happens with an early dismissal. We call the classroom, which interrupts. As the child gathers their things, learning stops. Please help us to make PG a better place for learning by bringing your child every day, making sure they stay all day, and ensuring they are on time!

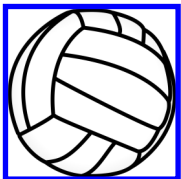

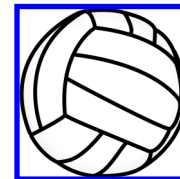

At the Bandstand!

With the retiring of Mr. Hushbeck, our resident play director, a few PGE parents, who love the arts, wanted to keep the tradition going and have taken on the task of directing a Winter/Spring Musical with the students of Pleasant Grove Elementary. Kate Nuttall, with the assistance of Darcie DeMille, will be directing the play alongside Allison Evans as choreographer. Kate and Darcie have been directing local children's musical theater plays together since 2016 and Allison owns a local dance company. Together with their years of experience working in the arts and with children, they are excited to welcome your children to audition for *"At the Bandstand!"*

Who can audition? Pleasant Grove Elementary Students in **3rd through 6th grade** (*1st and 2nd graders may be considered if they have older siblings participating*).

When are auditions? February 3rd or February 5th, 2:30-4:30. *To sign up for an audition time, pick up an audition packet in the front office which has all the details.*

When are rehearsals? February and March- Mondays and/or Wednesdays from 2:30-4:00, with a few exceptions. *Full rehearsal schedule is available in the audition packet found in the front office.*

When are performances? April 1 (*during school & evening*) and April 2nd (*during school*)

What is the cost? \$30 (to cover cast t-shirts, materials, cast party)

What is the musical? *"At the Bandstand!"* is a rock n' roll review. When Rockin' Robin, host of the hit TV show *At the Bandstand!*, announces an on-air dance-off to join the popular Bandstand Kids, Cindy and her girlfriends jump at the chance! But in order to succeed, Cindy will need to out-shine the spoiled daughter of the show's corporate sponsor. This musical includes familiar '50s songs, such as Rockin' Robin, Splish Splash, Shake, Rattle and Roll, Great Balls of Fire, and more.

6th Grade Parents!!

Please be aware that students entering 7th grade are required to have a Tdap Booster Shot (whooping cough).

Please bring an updated copy of the shot records to our office once the shot is received.

If the student does not receive the shot before the first day of 7th grade, the student will **NOT** be allowed to attend classes!!

Cold and Flu Season

The cold and flu season is here! Since germs and illnesses are easily spread at school to students and staff, please take a moment to review the illness policies below. Thank you!



Fever

An elevation of the normal body temperature.

Signs and Symptoms

- Onset may be abrupt with a shocking chill.
- In general a temperature of 100 degrees, or above shall be considered a fever.
- Sweating flushed face, hot or dry skin.
- Loss of appetite
- Complaint of feeling warm
- Nausea, sometimes vomiting

Dismissal and Readmission Policy

A student with a temperature 100.0 F or above must be dismissed from school. The student must be fever-free for 24 hours without medication before returning from school. This means that if a student is sent home with a fever, they cannot return to school the next day.

Common Cold

An acute infection of the upper respiratory tract, usually lasting five to seven days.

Signs and Symptoms

- Nasal stuffiness, sneezing, and nonproductive cough
- Mild sore throat, enlarged neck glands
- Fever
- Red and watery eyes
- Decreased appetite

Dismissal and Readmission Policy

A student will be dismissed from school for the following: a fever of 100.0F or higher, the student is too ill or uncomfortable to function adequately in the classroom, excessive coughing or colored drainage from the nose. The student may return when they have been fever-free for 24 hours and he or she is able to attend to classroom activities and assignments, and drainage is clear during the daytime.

Diarrhea

Signs and Symptoms

- Watery, copious bowel movements
- Bowel movement may be green in color
- Foul odor

Dismissal and Readmission Policy

A student will not be dismissed for one loose stool unless another sign of illness exist. The student must be fever-free for 24 hours. If the diarrhea persists, student must have a written statement from the doctor that no viral, bacterial, or other contagious condition exists.

Nausea or Vomiting **(Gastroenteritis)**

Causes, Signs and Symptoms

- Certain viruses (eg Norovirus)
- Certain medications may cause nausea and vomiting
- Upset stomach, dizziness, and anxiety may cause vomiting
- Paleness, abdominal pain may occur with nausea and vomiting

Dismissal and Readmission Policy

A student that is vomiting must be dismissed from school, even if they are “feeling better” after vomiting. A student must be vomit-free for 24 hours before returning to school.

If a person has repetitive vomiting and diarrhea, Public Health advises staying home for 48 hrs after last episode.
