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OUR SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Tappan Zee High School is fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and the New York State Education Department as per guidelines established by the New York State Board of Regents. We have a 9-period day comprising of two semesters and four marking periods. The total enrollment for the high school is 908, with a student to counselor ratio of 200:1.

South Orangetown Central School District is a high-performing, public school district which serves the residents of Blauvelt, Grandview-on-Hudson, Orangeburg, Palisades, Piermont, Sparkill and Tappan, New York.

The Counseling Department is comprised of a Team Leader and four counselors who provide a comprehensive program that includes individual and group counseling at each grade level.

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COVID STATEMENT

Tappan Zee High School halted in person learning on March 13th, 2020, due to the pandemic. Buildings remained closed for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year. During the 2020-2021 school year, our district implemented a hybrid learning approach where half the student body would attend one week while the other half would attend remotely from home. Each week the cohort in the building would switch. A combination of synchronous and asynchronous instruction was utilized by our faculty during the entirety of remote learning (March 2020-June 2021)

The grade point average, computed at the end of the sixth semester, includes all courses or classes in which a student received a grade. TZHS does not provide an exact rank for our seniors.

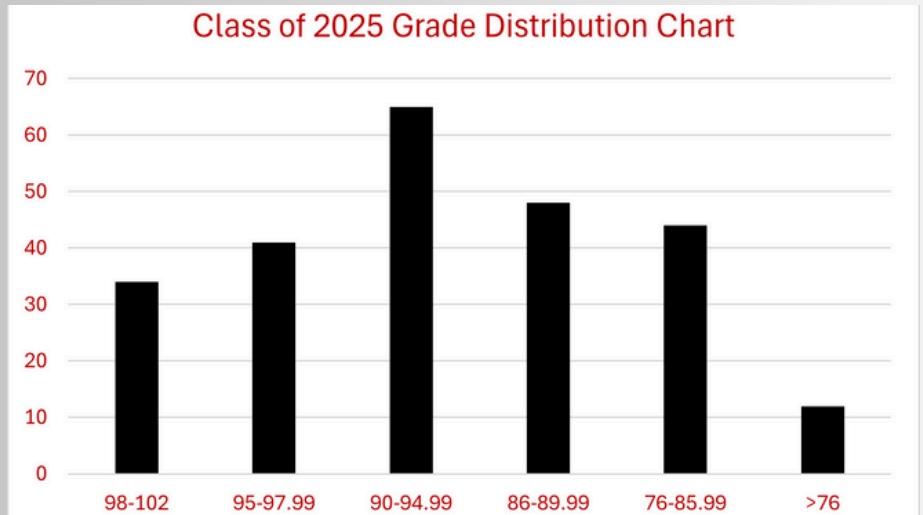
Beginning in 2023, courses taken outside of TZHS will not be calculated in the cumulative GPA.
