

The Perspectives of Transgender People Are Necessary in Schools!

According to the Williams Institute at UCLA:

- 1.6M people in the U.S. ages
 13+ identify as trans
- 18% of people who identify as trans are ages 13-17

According to the CDC in 2021:

- 69% of queer youth reported feeling persistently hopeless
- Queer students were 4 times more likely to attempt suicide than cis/het peers
- Queer youth consistently report higher rates of bullying and violence, and are more likely to miss school as a result
