Install Lean Library Browser Extension

Go to www.leanlibrary.com/download or just look up *Lean Library download* in your favorite search engine.

Lean Library can be installed on most laptop and desktop browsers. For mobile devices/tablets, Lean Library is only available on iOS via the browser app, Academic Browser.

If you use multiple browsers, you will need to install Lean Library on each one.

Accessible via keyboard shortcut

You can use keyboard shortcuts to open the extension.

Go to <https://tinyurl.com/LLshortcut> or Google/Search for “Lean Library Accessibility Keyboard Shortcuts” and arrive at the “Accessibility: Keyboard Shortcuts” page to find out how to set keyboard shortcuts in each browser.

Keyboard shortcuts are currently not supported on Safari and Edge.


Note: The pop-ups display different messages when on-campus versus off-campus.



Google/Search *jstor*


When you arrive at [jstor.org](https://www.jstor.org), if you're off-campus, you will encounter a Lean Library pop-up. Click on **Get Access** and it will send you to the Umass Boston login page. If you're on-campus, Lean Library won't pop-up, but when you click on the extension icon, it will provide you with a "Success you have access" message.

We have Lean Library set up to recognize the sites that we have subscription access to. When-off-campus, the extension gives you the opportunity to authenticate and access JSTOR through the library subscription, without needing to go through the library website to get the proxied link.

This is also set up for the other publisher sites that we have access to: IEEE Explore, Wiley, ScienceDirect, etc.

Google Scholar Integration

There is usually a process to get Google Scholar set up with Umass Boston linking when you're searching off-campus, but with Lean Library, you don't have to do that.

For practice off-campus: go to Google Scholar - scholar.google.com - and search *engineering education for women*. Find It @ UMBrella links will show up if we have access via our subscriptions.

When you are on an article page, it does a search in UMBrella. If there are no detected holdings in UMBrella, it will offer this option to order the article.


