



Mass. Memories Road Show

Your Place in Massachusetts History

The Mass. Memories Road Show is a state-wide digital history project that documents people, places and events in Massachusetts history through photographs and stories. In partnership with teams of local volunteers, we organize free public events to scan family and community photographs and videotape “the stories behind the photos.” The images and stories are added to an online educational database at openarchives.umb.edu.

Since 2004, the project has collaborated with over three dozen communities and gathered more than 10,000 photographs and stories from across the state. We hope to bring the Road Show to all of the 351 communities of Massachusetts, providing access to family photographs and stories, building community knowledge and connections, and creating a digital portrait of the Commonwealth’s history and culture.
