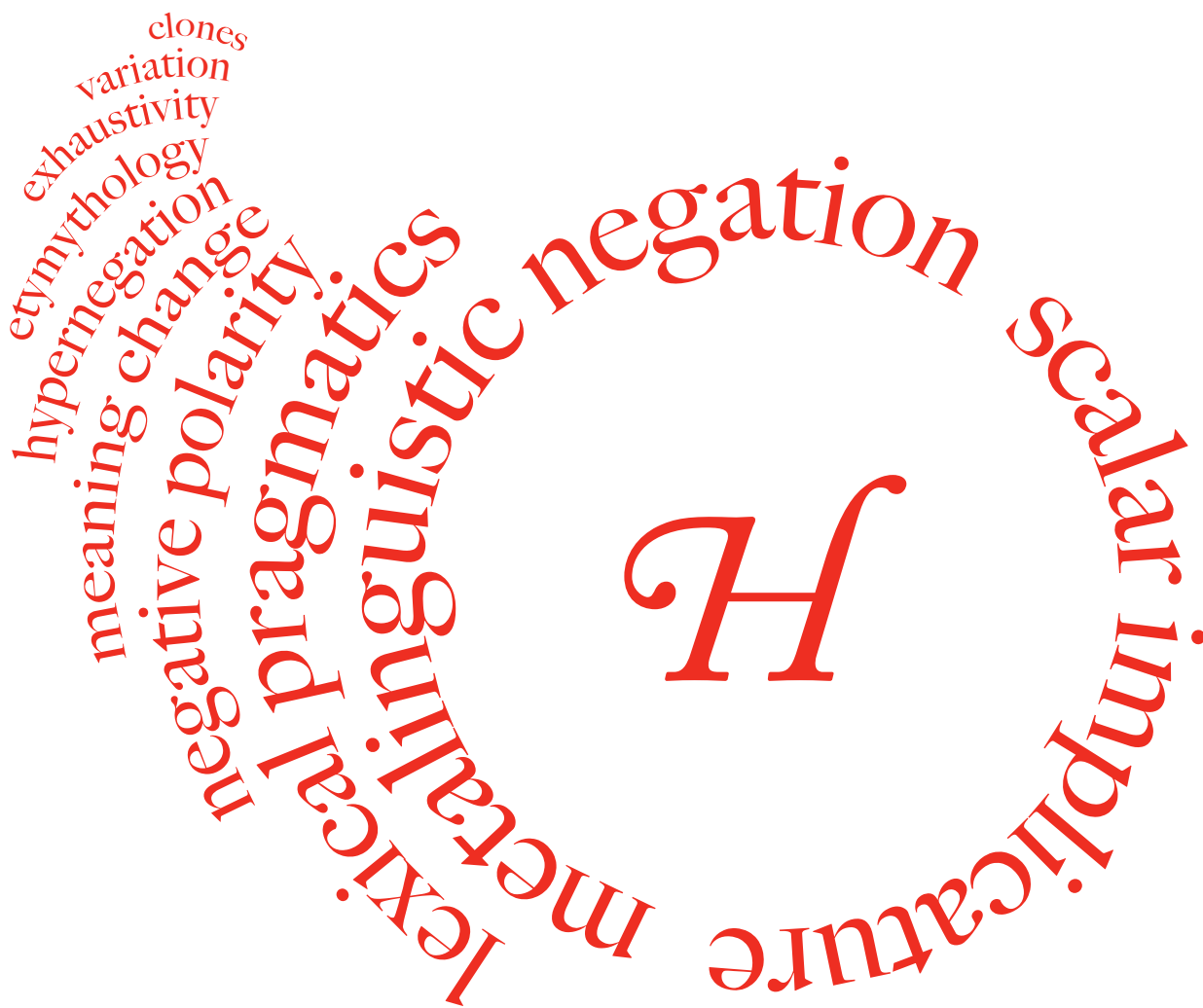


Hornucopia

Laurence R. Horn's contributions to the field of natural language semantics and pragmatics cannot be overstated. His work in neo-Gricean pragmatics has been enormously influential, with especially significant contributions in the analysis of negation and the theory of scalar implicature. Horn's work is infused with wit, elegance and erudition, and his 1989 book, *A Natural History of Negation*, is widely considered to be a masterpiece for all of these reasons.
