

Tools for Blended/Online Teaching

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Keep it in mind:

- Do not overload the course with technology. Less is more. (recommend 2-3 tools per course)
- When possible, leverage your school's current system. Check with your school for available (or licensed) supported tools.

Interpretive mode: students interact with learning materials

Create Grammar Tutorial Videos	Zoom, Adobe Spark, Powtoon, Screencastify, Apowersoft, Loom
Embedded Video Quiz	Kaltura, Edpuzzle (for youtube), Playposit, H5P, Panopto
Social Reading/Annotation	Zoom, Google doc, Google slides, Classroom Salon, Perusall
Drawing/Graphic Organizer	Google Drawing, Classkick
Poll/Survey	Zoom, Google forms, Kahoot (word cloud), Polleverywhere (word cloud)

Interpersonal mode: negotiate the meaning among individuals

Synchronized: Student-Teacher Interaction Student-Student Interaction	Zoom breakout session, Google meet
Asynchronized: Social media	Instagram, Wechat, Line, Twitter, Facebook

Presentational mode: create messages to inform, narrate, describe, explain...

Audio/Video Recording Speaking Activities	Zoom, Flipgrid, Voicethread, Classkick, Learning Management System for your school (LMS)
Digital storytelling	Zoom, Imovie, Powtoon, StoryMap
Writing assignment	Padlet, Classkick, Google doc, Issuu, LMS

Gamified activities: Kahoot, Wordwall, Quizlet Live, Quizizz, GimKit, Pear Deck, Nearpod
