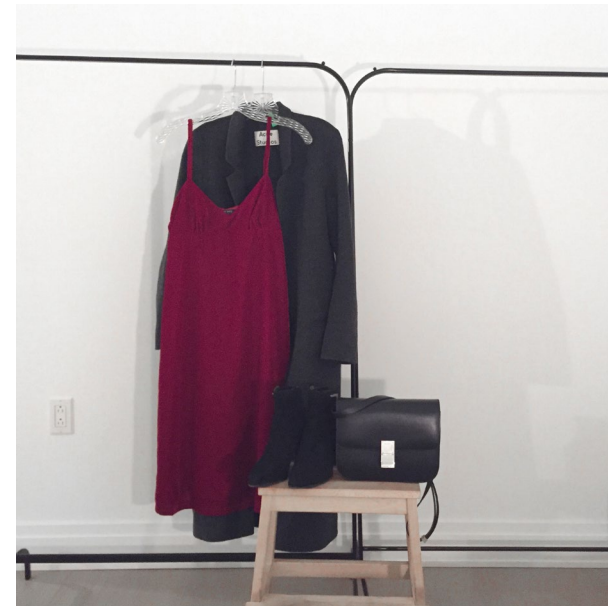

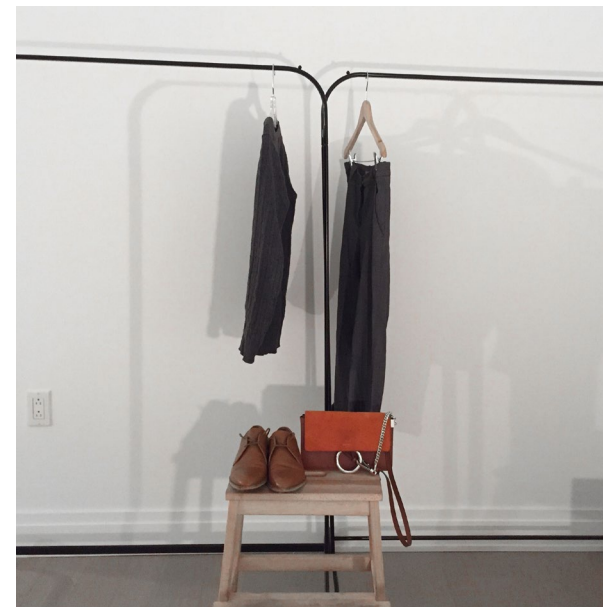


Friday Oct 7

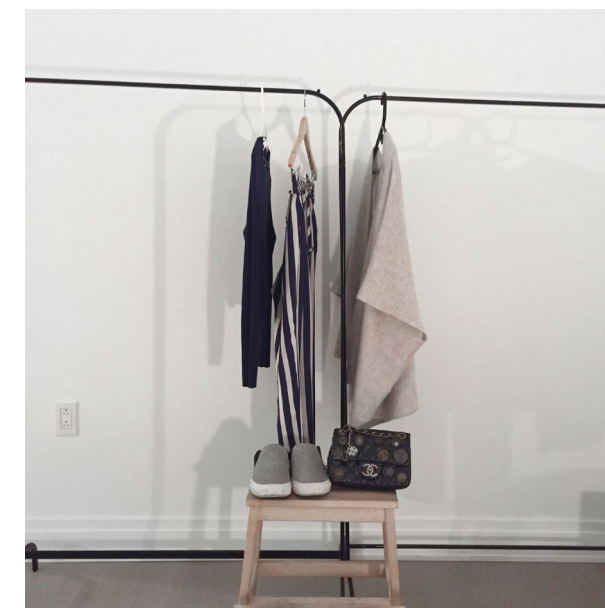


Saturday Oct 8

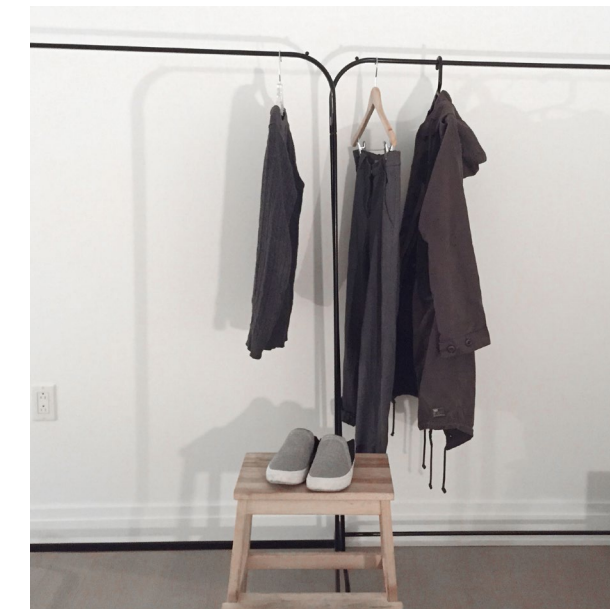

This formal body was more tightly constrained in terms of its visual appearance, its contours firmly demarcated by tailored clothing, especially by the tailored jacket with marks a clear boundary around the body in much the same way as a man's suit jacket does (Enteistle, 2002: 141). Also, choosing the intellectual style clothes gives visible form to the professional woman, marking her out as a business woman, lawyer, and manager, as supposed to a secretary or other clerical workers. Thus, the strictness in colors or trouser outfit articulates a very particular kind of body: one that is feminine and professional at the same time. Such a public body is relatively recent historical invention since only recently have women become visible as professional women. To my reflection, it also about how did I want to represent myself and how did I want my friend perceive me through my styling which was to be intellectual.

Sundays are chill to me. I went to Soho to have brunch with my girlfriends. I chose a striped navy pants to have nautical vibes and a wool cover up to stay warm. Going out with friends are relaxing but competitive, because everyone dresses up on weekends and show out their styles and aesthetics. Or simply just showing off the new purse they just bought. It is as Enteistle had said that our dress does not belong to our bodies but to the social world as well. 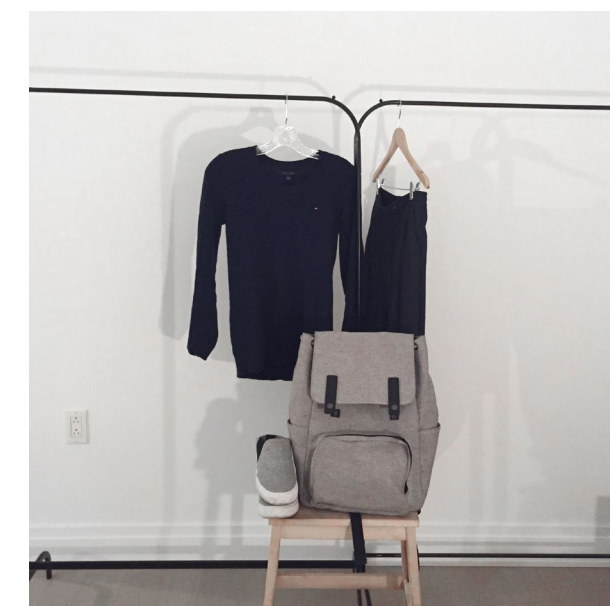
Monday Oct 10

The lack of time to organize the wardrobe often leads to clothing being stuffed rather than folded or items such as handbags and shoes colonizing the undesignated areas of the wardrobe, such as the space at the bottom of the hanging area (Woodward, 2007: 41).
