Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) HEERF II

Published January 14, 2021

On March 27, 2020, the Federal government enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), Pub L. No. 116-136, providing funds to institutions from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) to make Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus, including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance, such as food, course materials, technology, health care, and child care. CARES Act HEERF grantees received a supplemental CRRSAA HEERF II Grant in 2021 under Section 314(a)(1).

The law requires institutions to report certain information related to the use of these funds. The following information is reported for the period, **June 30, 2021 to September 30, 2021.**

This statement shall serve to acknowledge that our institution signed and returned to the US Department of Education the *Certification and Agreement - Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students*. We further attest that our institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a) (1) and (a) (4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

- I. The total amount of funds that the institution received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a) (1) and (a) (4) programs is **\$52,372.**
- II. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a) (1) and (a) (4) programs as of **June 30, 2021 is \$52,374, (final disbursement HEERF II).**
- III. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a) (1) and (a) (4) programs as of the date of submission **\$52,374**
- IV. The total number of students that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grant to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a) (1) and (a) (4) programs is **TWENTY-ONE.**
- V. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a) (1) and (a) (4) programs is **TWENTY-ONE.**
- VI. The following is the method used by our institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students and how much each student will receive under CRRSAA and ARP (a) (1) and (a) (4) programs.

PROVIDE DESCRIPTION: Distribution of the CRRSAA Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students will be provided to 21 eligible Title IV recipients with a low EFC score between zero (0) to 2596, and do not have any other educational benefits. Each qualified student will receive \$2494. These students are not required to use the CRRSAA funds to pay their tuition balance.

- Value: VII. The following instructions/directions/guidance will be provided by our institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

PROVIDE DESCRIPTION: Eligible Title IV recipients will receive electronically the CRRSAA Form with instructions from the Financial Aid Advisor. Students may elect to pay all or part of their tuition balance with their CRRSAA funds or request the full grant amount as a check payment. All signed CRRSAA grant requests will be processed as check payments.
