

HOW TO PROPOSE A GE TRACK

The UCLA Teagle project is working to establish a menu of GE Tracks for undergraduate engineering students to engage them in a meaningful and coherent set of humanities courses while meeting their GE requirements.

The GE Tracks also allows departments in Humanities to advertise their GE classes to Engineers.

Submitting a proposed GE Track requires the following:

1. A brief description of why the track might be interesting to engineers
2. Include a range of course options for students so they can at least partially meet the GE requirements by taking 3 or more courses in a given track. [Click here to see examples of Existing GE Tracks](#)
3. Confirm that the courses in the proposed GE Track are currently approved GE courses. Identify the following GE Foundations of Knowledge areas and subgroup for each course—*listed below with the requirement for each foundational area.*

ARTS AND HUMANITIES

Requirement: Two 5-unit courses selected from two different subgroups.

- Literary and Cultural Analysis
- Philosophical and Linguistic Analysis
- Visual and Performing Arts Analysis and Practice

SOCIETY AND CULTURE

Requirement: Two 5-unit courses, one from each subgroup.

- Historical Analysis
- Social Analysis

SCIENTIFIC INQUIRY

Requirement: One course (4 units minimum) from the Live Sciences subgroup.

- Life Science

Note that some courses will fall under more than one of the foundational knowledge areas and subgroups.
