CTEL Course Modalities

Our courses are offered in a variety of modalities to accommodate the needs and schedules of our faculty members. By offering these varied modalities, we aim to ensure that all faculty members can access professional development opportunities regardless of their location, schedule, or preferred learning style.

Here are the primary formats we offer:

In-Person: An In-Person, or face to face, professional development course is delivered on campus during scheduled meeting days and times.






Blended: A Blended professional development course consists of facilitated on-campus or virtual live instruction as well as an online D2L component. The majority of the coursework is completed at the participant's own pace; however, participants must partake in a required synchronous live session(s) with the course facilitator. Before the official course start date, participants will receive an email with instructions on getting started, as well as any additional details such as the synchronous session(s) date(s) and time(s).






Live: A Live professional development course requires participants and course facilitators to meet synchronously via Zoom during designated days and times. Live sessions may include engaging online learning activities such as polls, small group breakout sessions, and hands-on/guided practice.




Online: In an Online professional development course, all instruction is completed fully online, asynchronously. Attendees will complete the course in a self-paced, facilitated online format in the college's learning management system (D2L Brightspace). The majority of the coursework is completed at the participant's own pace within an allotted time frame. Participants may partake in an optional synchronous live session(s) with the course facilitator(s). Before the official course start date, participants will receive an email with instructions on getting started, as well as any additional details such as the optional synchronous session(s) date(s) and time(s).





On-Demand: An On-Demand professional development course consists of all coursework being completed at the participant's own pace in an asynchronous, self-paced, fully online, format.
