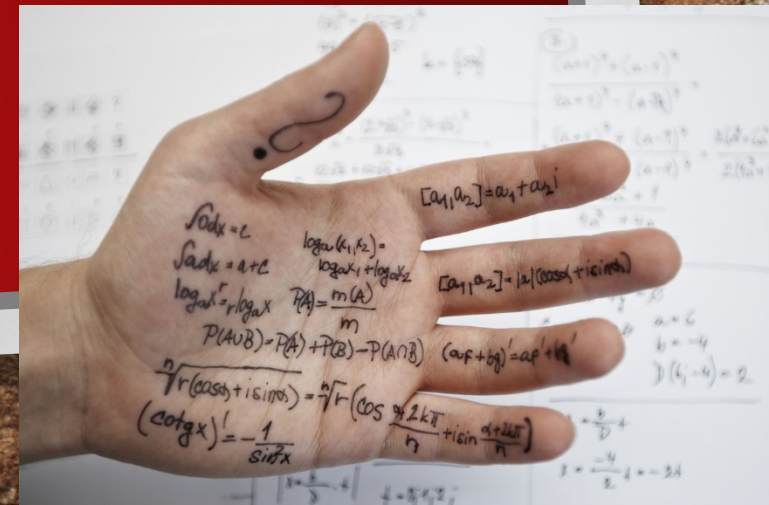
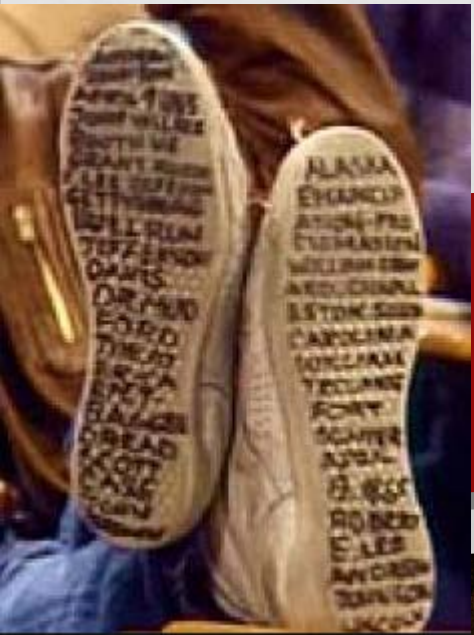

HOW CONCERNED ARE YOU ABOUT CHEATING?

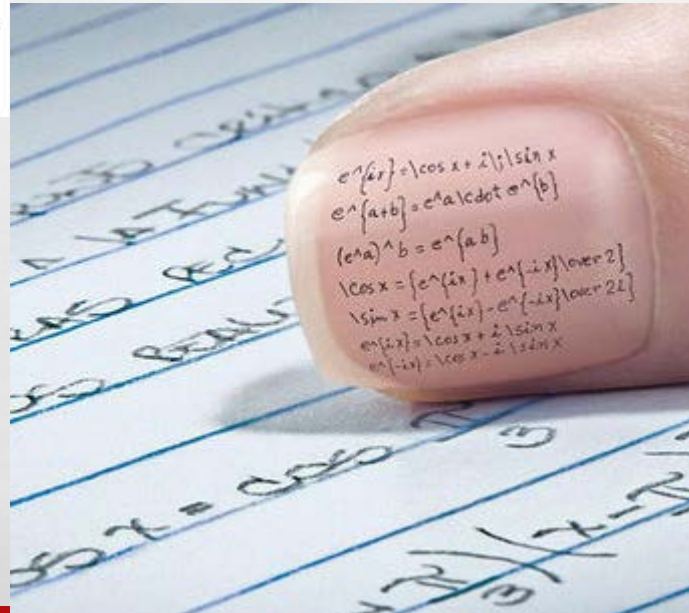
- A – HIGHLY CONCERNED

WHY DO STUDENTS CHEAT?

In my opinion, there are two reasons why students cheat. 1) They are not motivated to learn or engage the material, and 2) because the teacher is a lousy teacher and has not properly designed the course or learning materials. Few students set out to cheat and few really want to to cheat. Most students cheat because they are being assessed on things not covered in the course content or if it was covered it was done so in a way that does not inform the learn the learner of its importance (i.e. it was buried footnote on page 450 of a 900 page book). The best way to reduce cheating is to engage the learner, motivate them, make it clear what you expect of them, and assess them on only those expectations.

IDEAS FOR HOW TO PREVENT CHEATING (1)

- REMIND STUDENTS OF THE [ACADEMIC HONESTY POLICY](#)
- REMIND STUDENTS OF HOW YOU DEFINE CHEATING
- CELL PHONES MUST BE PUT INTO BACKPACKS/PURSES IN A NOT EASILY ACCESSIBLE
- PRODUCE MULTIPLE VERSIONS OF TESTS
- DO NOT LET ONE OCCURRENCE SLIDE.
- CREATE TESTS WHERE IT'S HARDER TO CHEAT. CHECK BY GOOGLING A PROBLEM, OR USING PHOTO MATH. (TRY $X^2 = 4$, $X^2 - 7 = 4$, $X^3 - X^2 = 1$)
- HAVE STUDENTS COME TO YOU WHEN THEY HAVE A QUESTION.



IDEAS FOR HOW TO PREVENT CHEATING (2)

- MAKE OLD TESTS OR SAMPLE QUESTIONS AVAILABLE TO REDUCE ANXIETY.
- ON TEST DAY, REARRANGE/RANDOMIZE SEATING TO SEPARATE FRIENDS (PARTNERS).
- MARK TESTS (EXAMS OR SCANTRONS) IN A WAY TO ELIMINATE THE RETURN-ERROR.
- CREATE OPEN BOOK TESTS OR ALLOW THEM TO USE A NOTECARD.
- NO WATER BOTTLES.
- CLEAR THE MEMORY/PROGRAMS ON THE CALCULATOR.
- COLLECT ALL SCRATCH PAPER AFTER A TEST



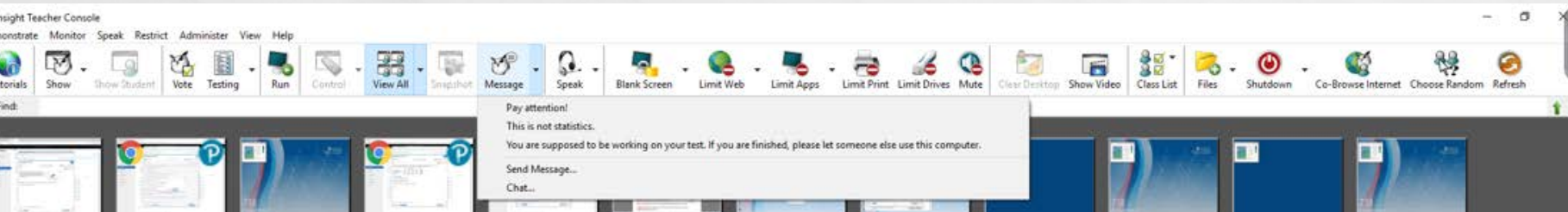
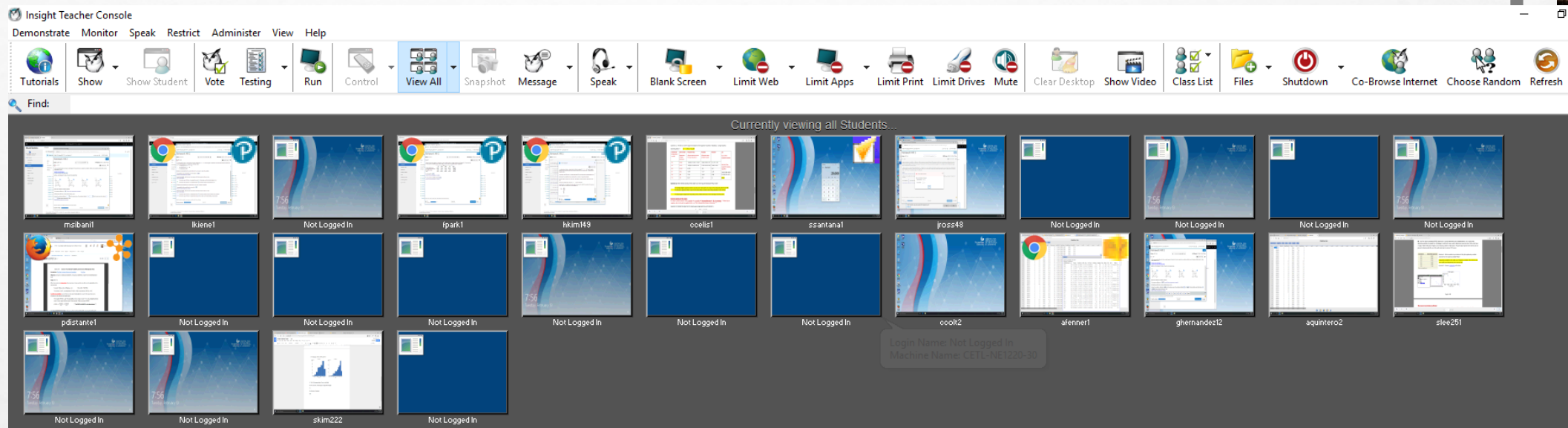

IDEAS FOR HOW TO PREVENT CHEATING (3)

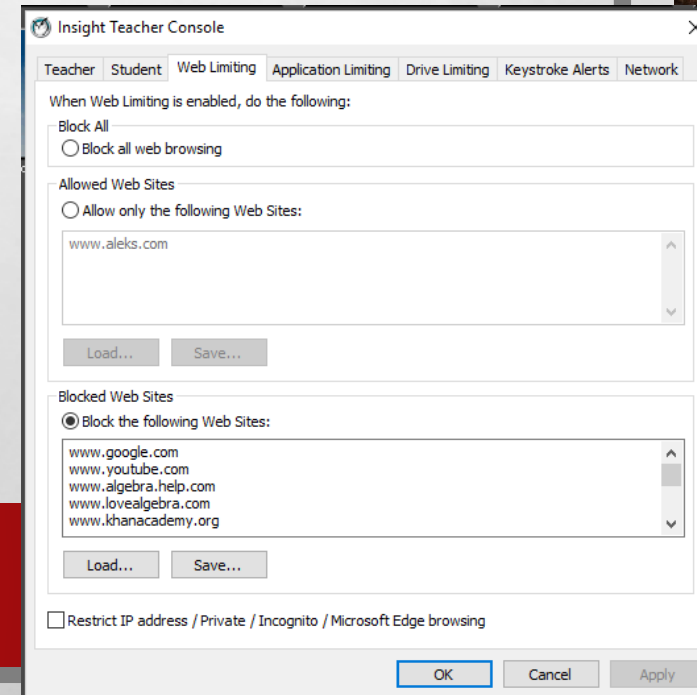
- ENCOURAGE COLLABORATION
- PASSWORD PROTECT ONLINE TESTS
- LABEL TESTS BY NUMBER AND ASSIGN TO ASSOCIATED STUDENTS
- USE INSIGHT AND BLOCK THE MOST POPULAR WEBSITES.
- USE LOCKDOWN BROWSERS (MYSTATLAB, RESPONDUS)
