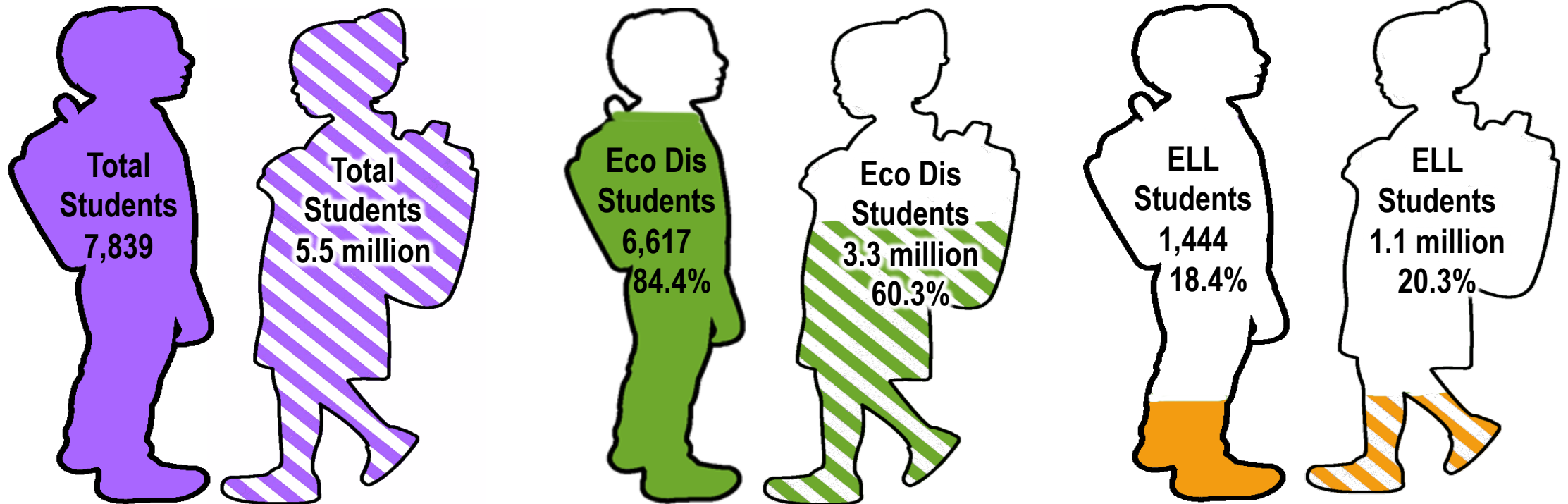

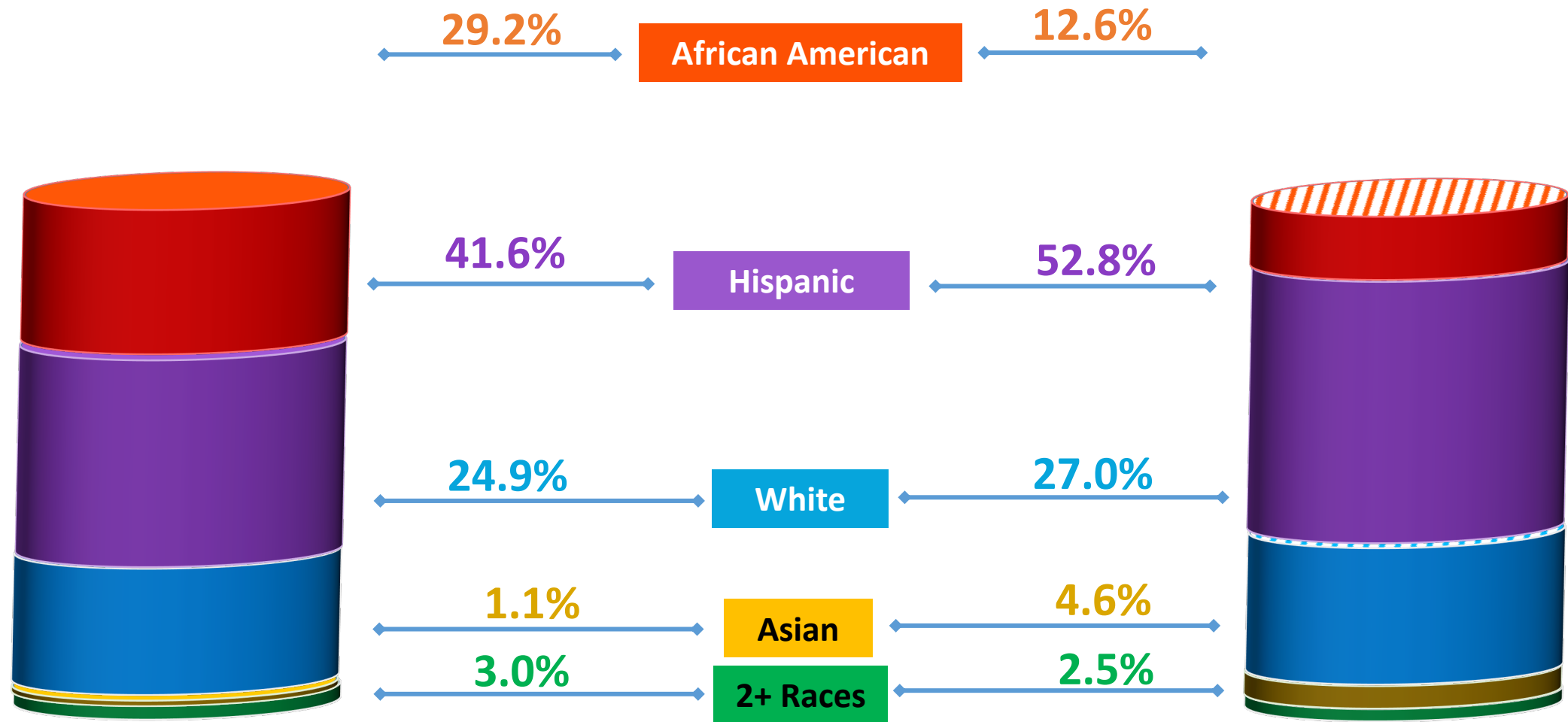

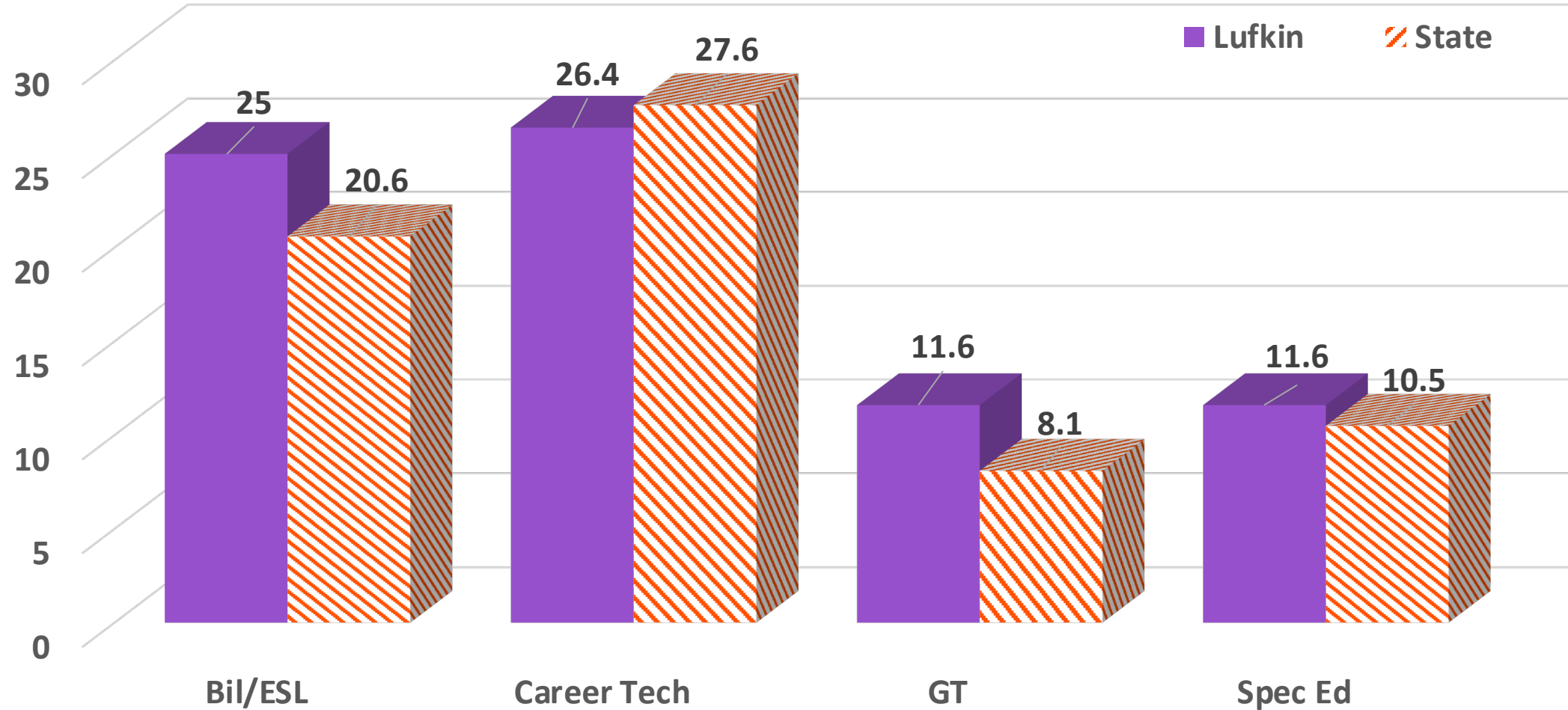

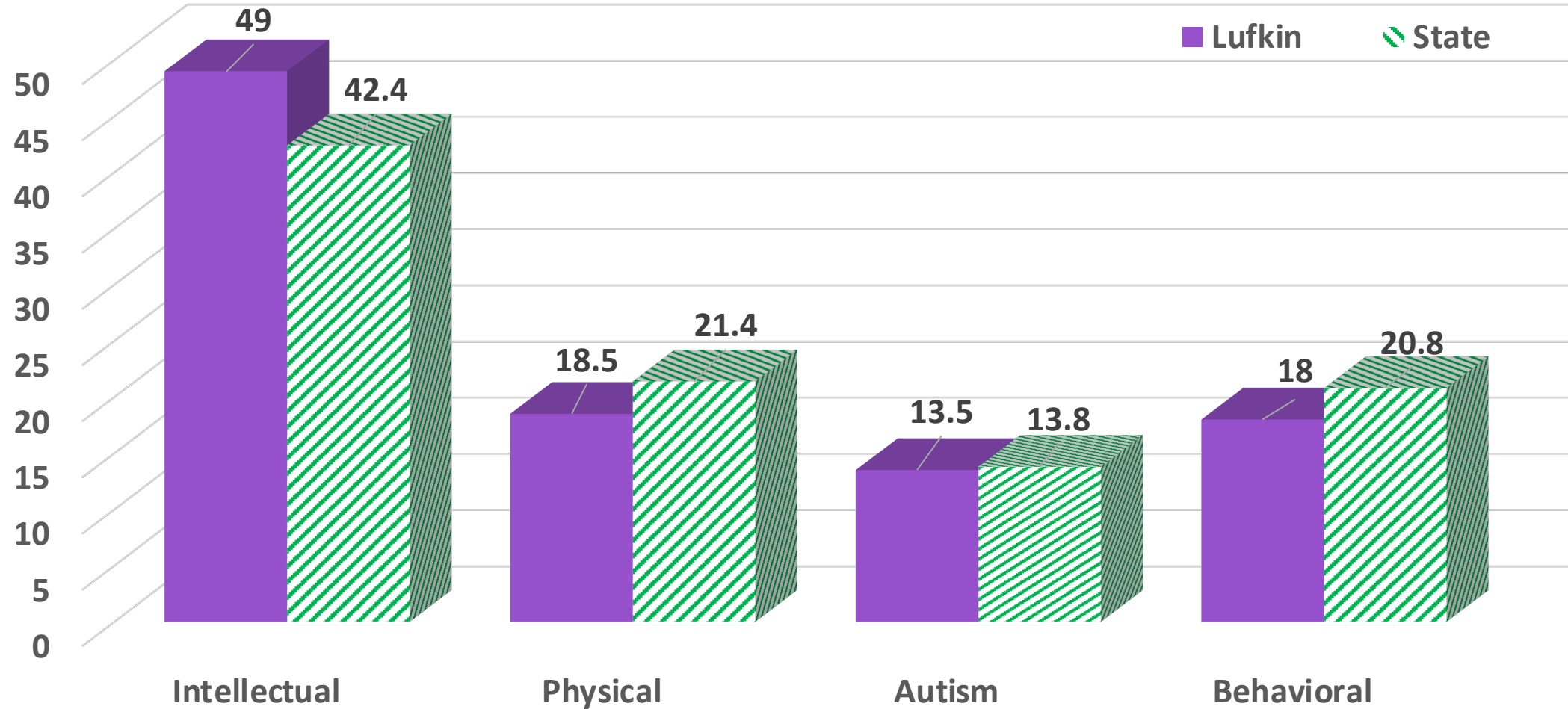

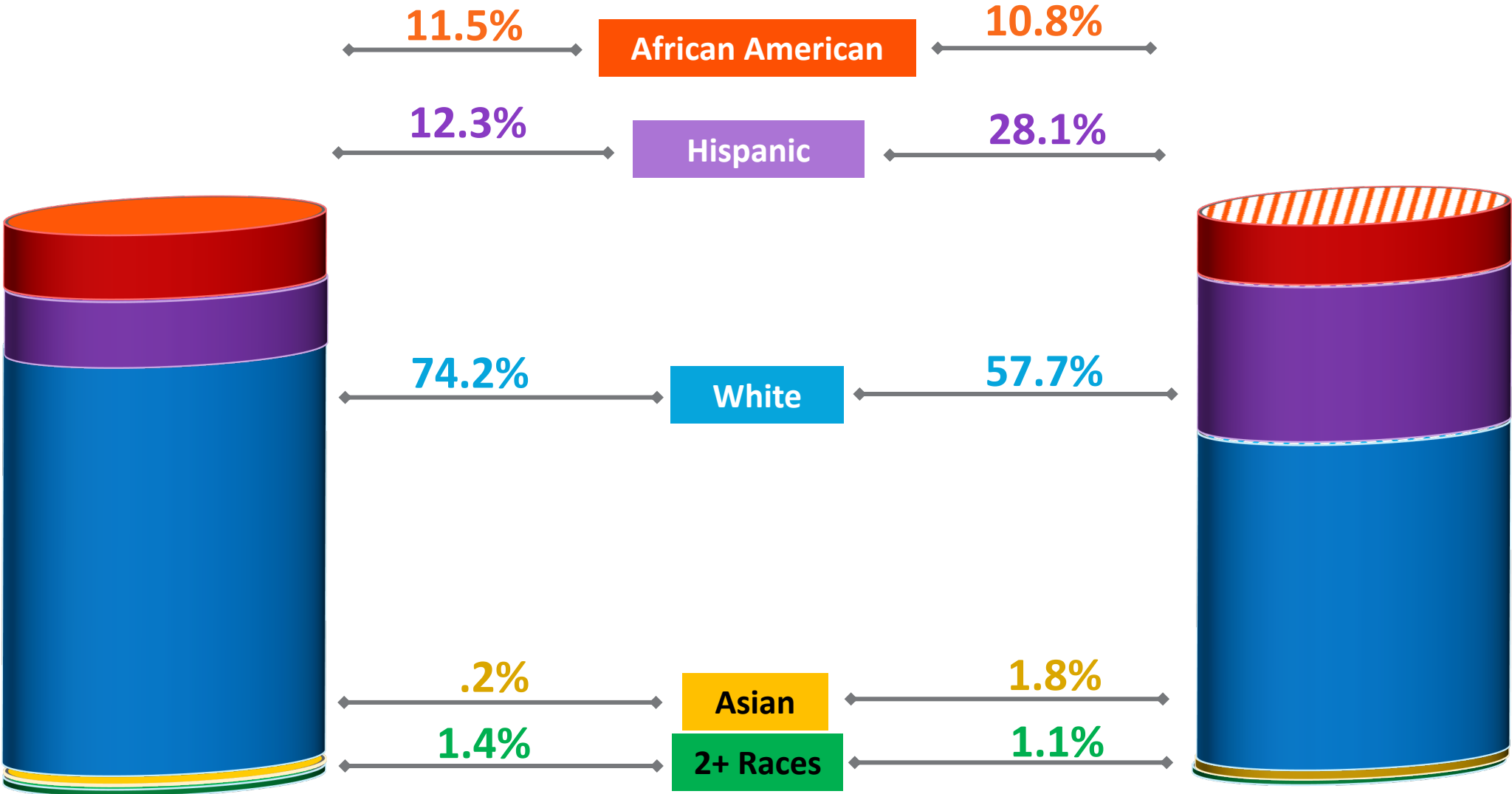

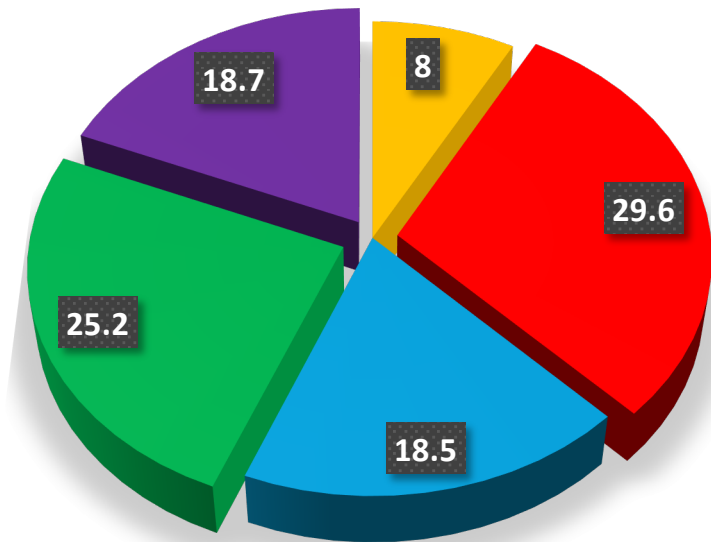

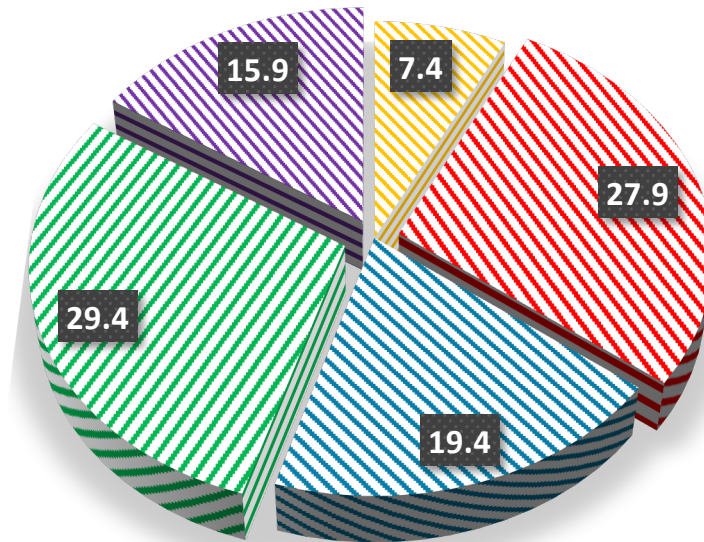

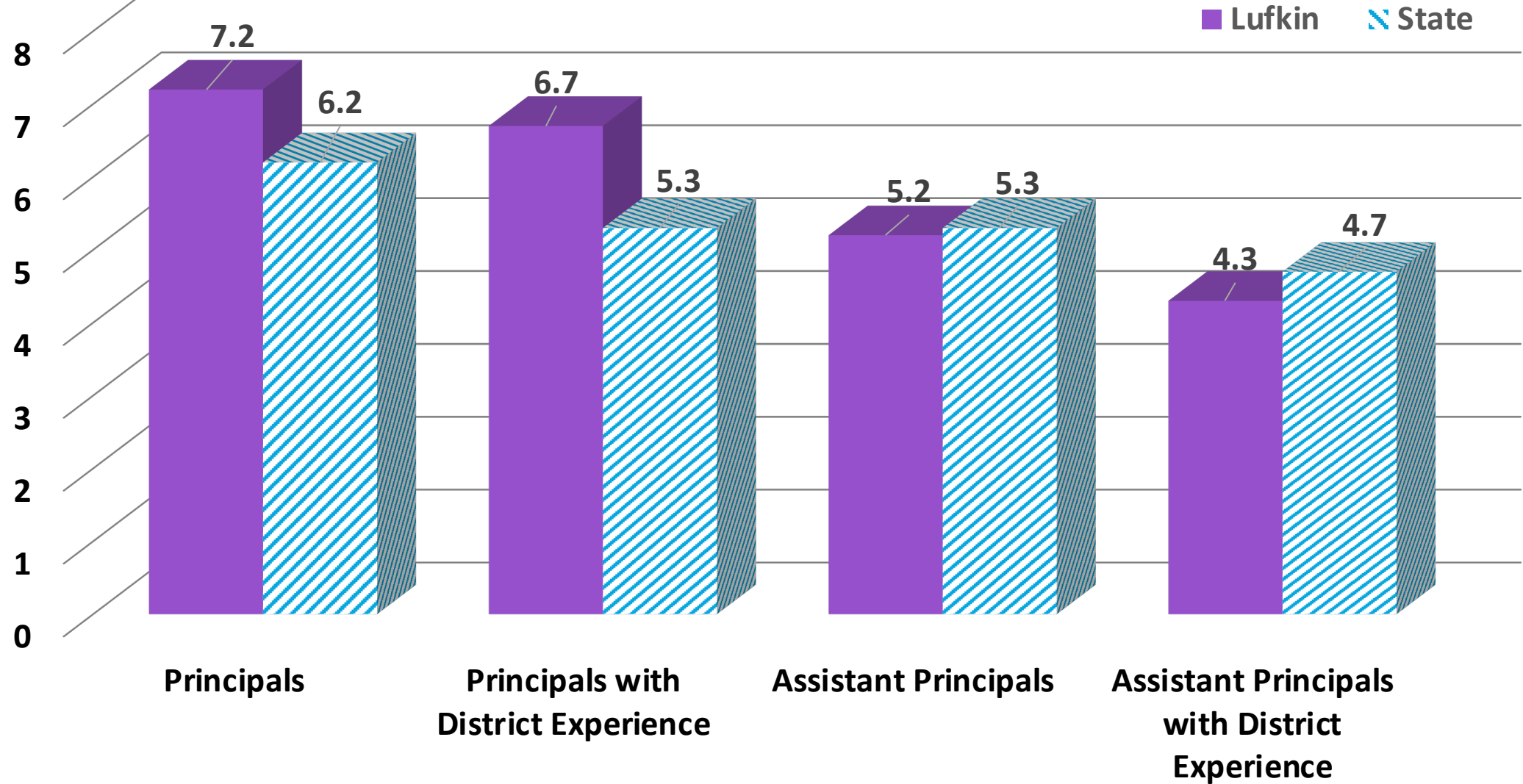

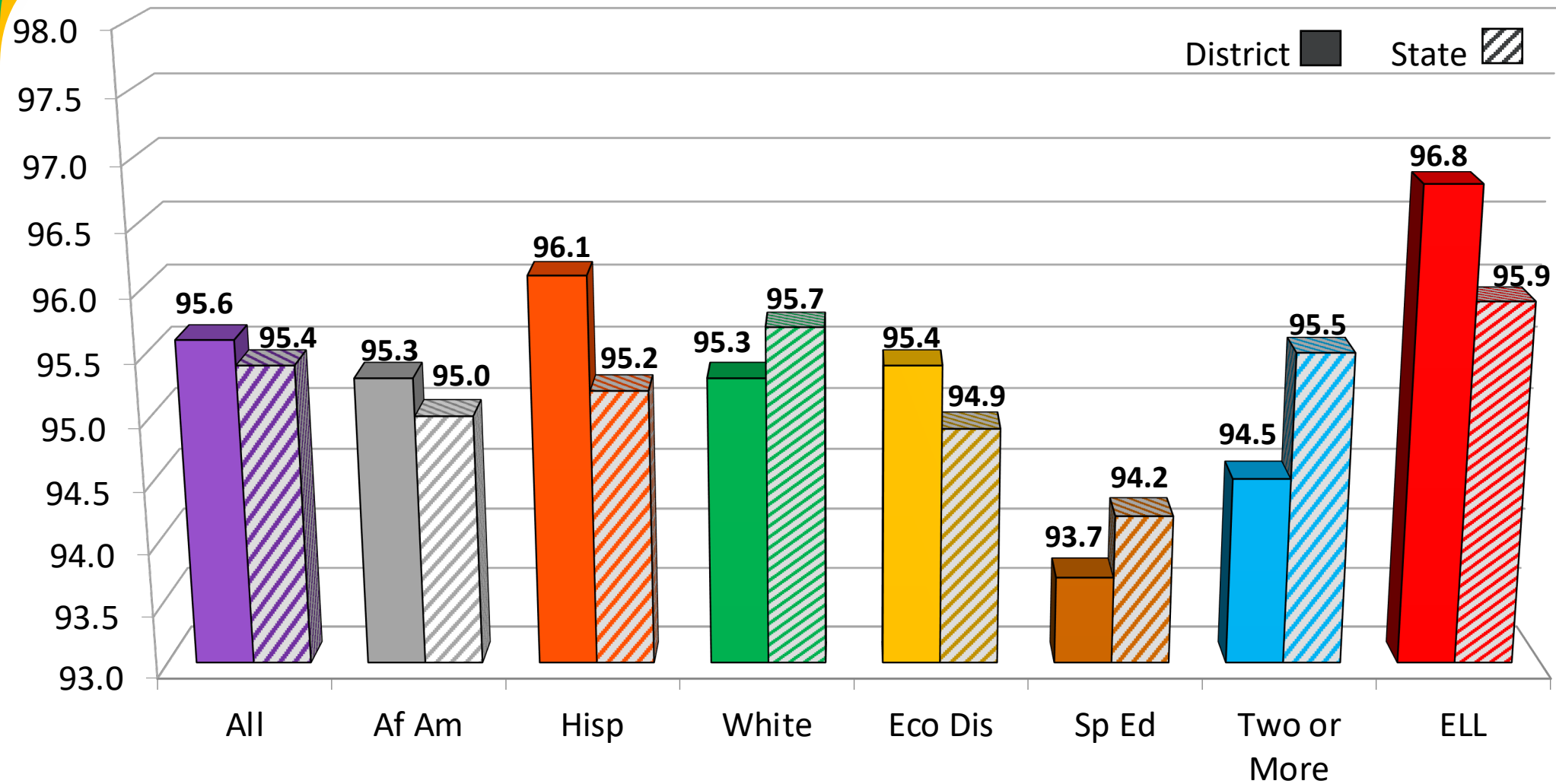

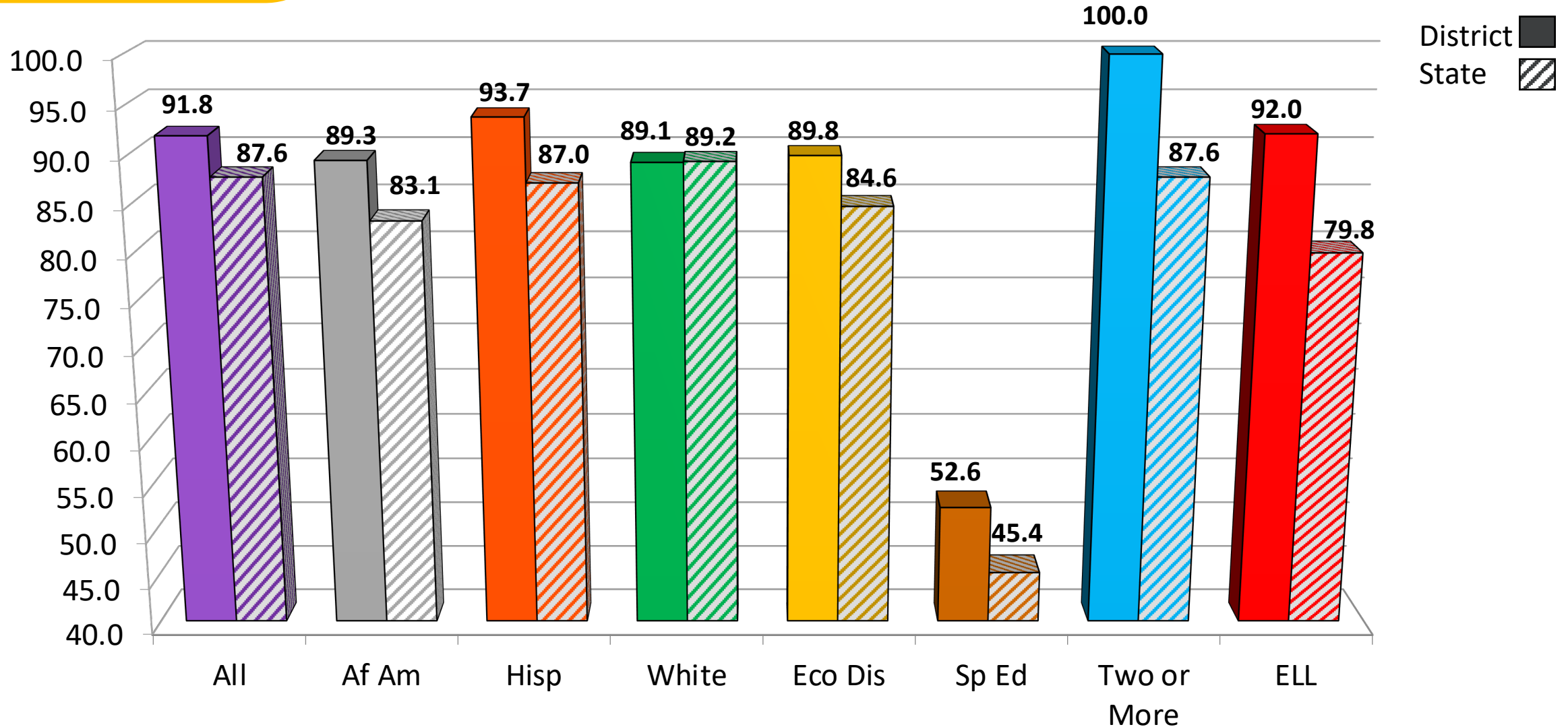

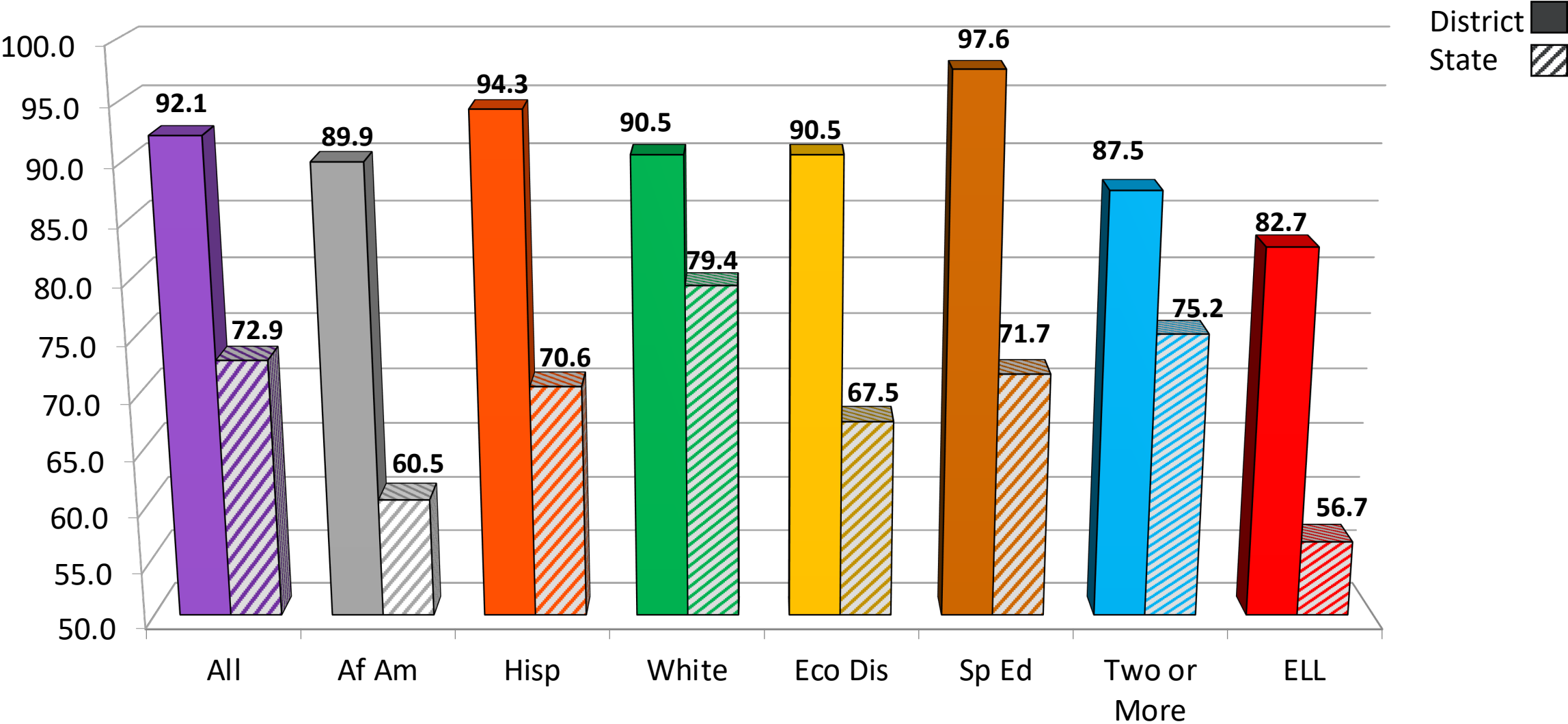


College, Career & Military Graduates

2019 CCMR Graduates

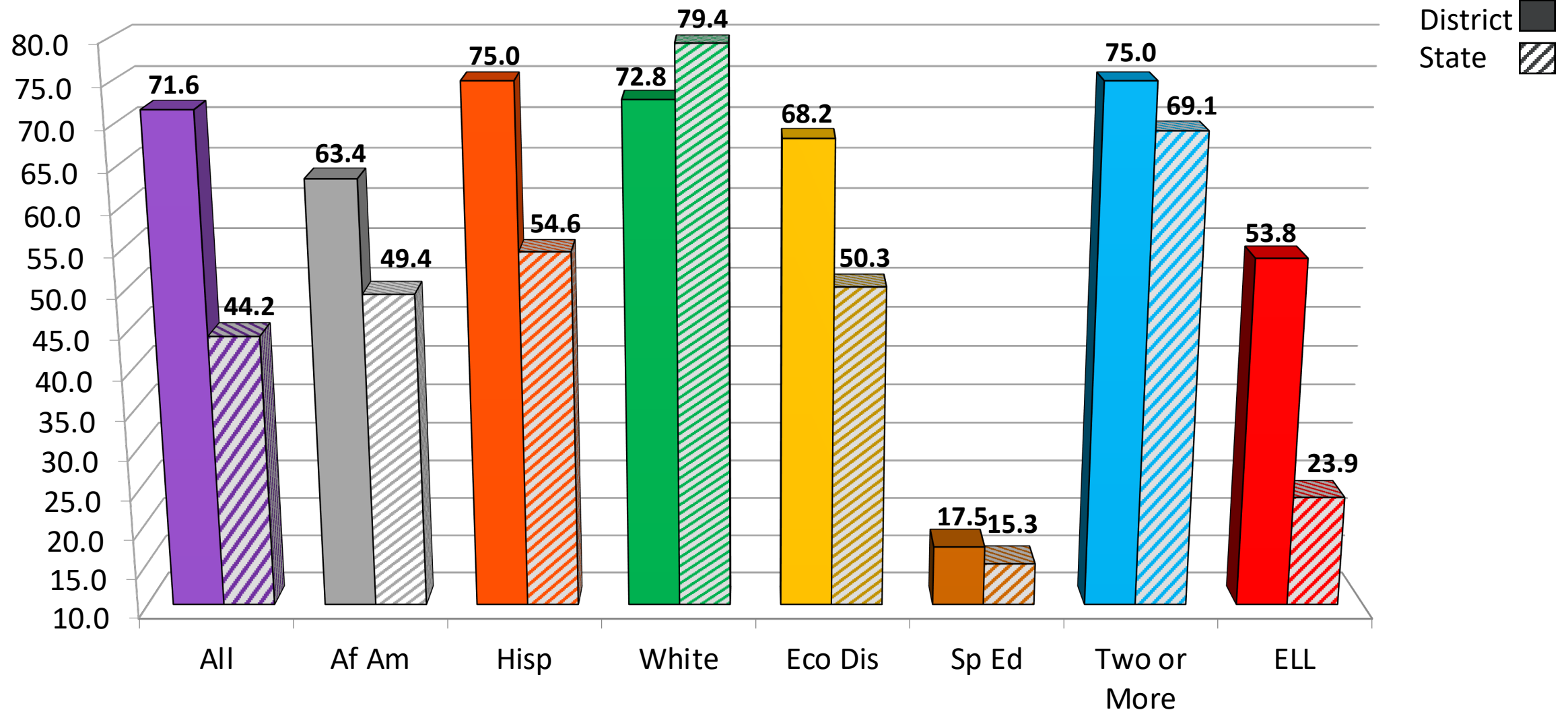
2018-19 School Year

2018-19 School Year

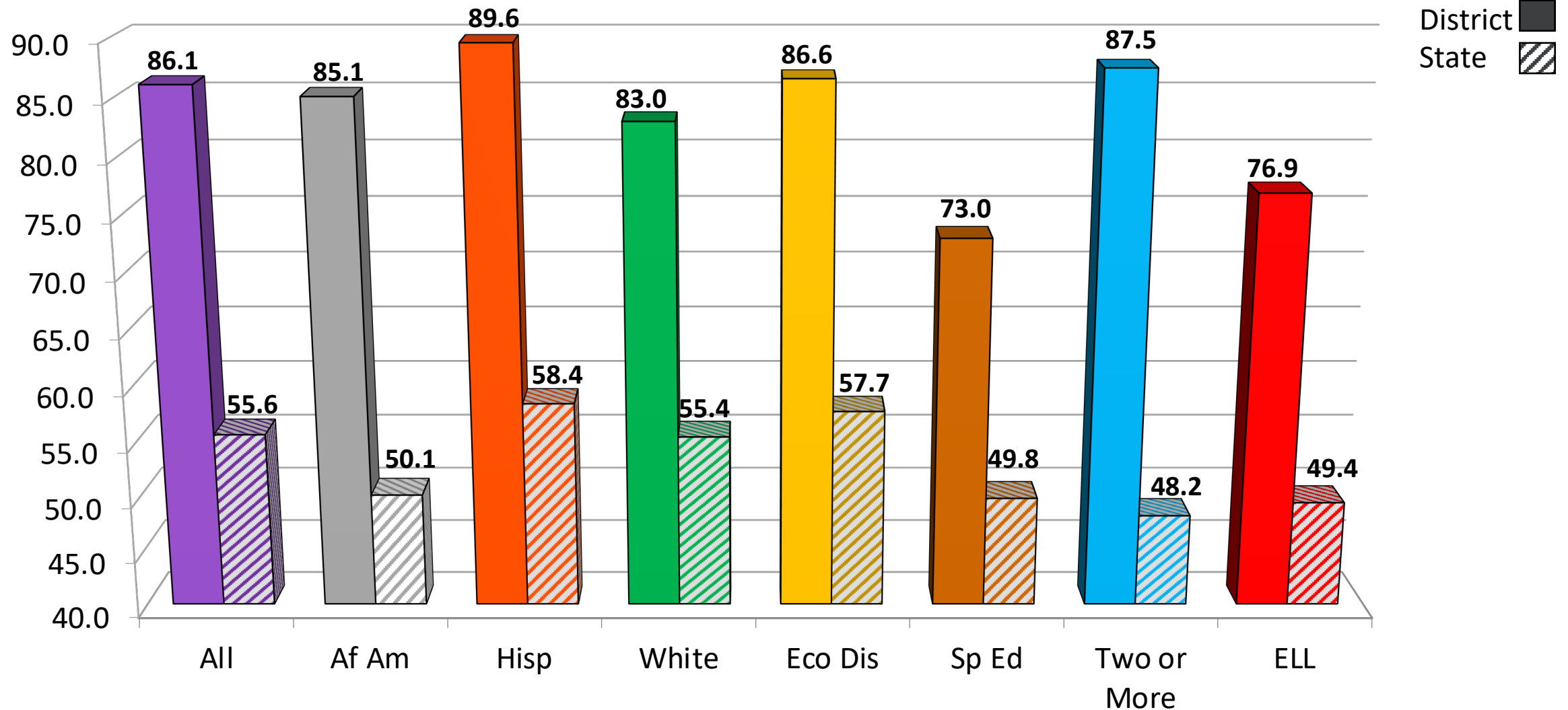
Math and English combined

College, Career, & Military Readiness Outcomes Bonus

The CCMR incentives allow districts to earn additional funds for preparing graduates for college, a career, or the military.

The purpose is to further the goal set under the state's plan for higher education developed under Texas Education Code (TEC) §61.051 for at least 60 percent of all adults aged 25 to 34 in Texas to achieve a postsecondary degree or workforce credential by 2030.

House Bill 3 CCMR incentives are directly aligned with the Texas Education Agency strategic plan that every child is prepared for success in college, career, or the military.



College, Career & Military Readiness Outcomes Bonus

CCMR bonuses are paid for each annual graduate above
a certain threshold percentage set by the state

Calculated based on meeting CCMR criteria **AND**
enrollment in college/military

Based on 2018 Graduates
CCMR bonus outcome estimate of \$415,000.

Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board

- Texas statute (TEC 51.403e) requires every district to include with its TAPR a report on student performance in postsecondary institutions during the first year enrolled after graduation from high school. The report includes:
 - *Number of Total Graduates, disaggregated by attendance in Institutes of Higher Education*
 - *Number of Students within each GPA reporting band*
