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All Grantee Meeting


On March 8th, the National Program Office hosted our 4th Annual All-Grantee Meeting at the 1917 Clinic in Birmingham, AL, our *first* in-person team gathering since February 2020! Held at UAB's 1917 Clinic, representatives from all three sites and the Merck Foundation came out to discuss project and cross-site evaluation updates. The meeting also allowed opportunity to hear from some experts in the field. Dr. Emma Kay, Director of the Magic City Research Institute, presented on community-engaged approaches to ending the HIV epidemic, calling on examples from her own work with Birmingham AIDS Outreach (BAO). Similarly, Dr. Gabriele Oates, Associate Professor in the UAB Department of Pediatrics, presented on utilizing social determinants of health (SDOH) in HIV outcomes research. We hope you all enjoyed hearing from each other and from our wonderful guest presenters as much as we did!

Data Overview:


As the National Program Office for <u>HIV Care Connect (HCC)</u>, the University of Alabama at Birmingham's Research and Informatics Service Center (RISC) is responsible for conducting ongoing evaluations for the funding organization, the Merck Foundation, in order to measure the effectiveness HCC interventions across all three sites. As part of these efforts, we collect clinical data on a quarterly basis from the sites. The below data illustrates viral suppression against several demographics for our latest data upload!

virai Suppression in (%) vs. missea visits




<= 200: 150 (78.5%) >200: 41 (21.5%)

Viral Suppression N (%) vs Race




<= 200: 156 (79.2%) >200: 41 (20.8%)
