





Alabama Preceptor Tax Incentive Program

The Alabama Preceptor Tax Incentive Program (APTIP) is collecting information from programs in the State that offer Preceptorships for eligible disciplines. In order for your preceptors to be eligible for the tax incentive, please register your program here.

In 2023, Alabama legislature approved the Alabama Preceptor Tax Incentive Program (APTIP) to offer a tax deduction to uncompensated healthcare professions students in our State. The goal of the APTIP is to increase medical student training in rural and underserved counties in Alabama.

Administered by the Alabama Statewide AHEC Program Office, APTIP provides a \$500 income tax credit incentive for each 160-hour clinical preceptorship rotation per calendar year for what would otherwise be unpaid work by community-based faculty preceptor positions. Precepting physicians are eligible for a maximum of \$6,000 per calendar year. Similarly, the law provides a \$425 tax incentive for each 160-hour clinical preceptorship rotation per calendar year for preceptors who are nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetists or physician assistants, with a \$5,100 annual maximum.

Alabama Statewide AHEC Partners with Community of Hope Health Clinic at Fiesta Birmingham

Our incredible teams from North Alabama AHEC and East Central Alabama AHEC partnered with the Community of Hope Health Clinic to offer health and vaccine information and services at Fiesta Birmingham on September 30, 2023. Throughout this lively event, our teams distributed 375 educational handouts written in Spanish, including COVID-19, influenza, shingles, and hand washing.



North Alabama AHEC's Health & Wellness Fair

North Alabama AHEC hosted a Health and Wellness Fair in Athens on October 21, 2023. The event, held at the Athens-Limestone County Public Library from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm, offered free health screenings, including blood pressure, blood glucose, dental, vision, and hearing checks. Attendees also had access to flu and COVID vaccinations and testing. Local community organizations participated, providing valuable resources.



Approximately 101 people attended the event. Two flu tests and four COVID tests were conducted by North Alabama AHEC. One attendee found motivation to address his hearing issues after a screening, stating, "I have tested my hearing today and can have the motivation to go again and find out how I can get a hearing aid." The Health and Wellness Fair aimed to promote community health and well-being in Athens.


