### **Honoring National Social Workers Month**

In celebration of National Social Workers Month, the March AHEC Scholars Webinar featured an insightful discussion with Katie Lynn Owens, an Alabama AHEC Scholars Alumni and registered social worker. Katie Lynn provided a comprehensive look into the critical role social workers play in healthcare and the importance of interdisciplinary collaboration in improving patient care.

Katie Lynn is an Oncology Social Worker in Huntsville, AL at the Clearview Cancer Institute, where she provides compassionate care and support to adult oncology and hematology patients.



During the session. Katie Lynn emphasized when and how to refer patients to social workers, ensuring they receive the support they need. She also addressed common stigmas surrounding social workers, debunking misconceptions and highlighting their vital role in advocating for patients, coordinating resources, and addressing social determinants of health (SDoH). Through case discussions and real-world examples, she guided participants on how to work collaboratively with social workers to provide the best possible care for patients and their families.

This webinar reinforced the essential contributions of social workers in holistic, patient-centered healthcare and the need for healthcare professionals to recognize their expertise in navigating complex social and economic challenges.
