
## Levels 1 and 2 2nd Quarter Data (April-June 2024)



#### Hypothermia Prevention Key Driver Diagram






## **Challenges & Barriers**



- Change of process:
  - 1. Standardized Room Temps > 72°F
  - 2. OR Temp > 72°F
  - 3. Warmers in all Delivery Rooms/OR/ER (set up)
  - 4. Prewarmed Isolette < 1600gms
  - 5. Skin to Skin minimum 1 hour
  - 6. Delay Weight
  - 7. Delay Bath







## **Opportunities**



- Standardized Education for Staff and Providers.
- Eliminate the need for unnecessary interventions related to hypothermia.
- Improve Bonding
- Improve First Latch Opportunity
- Promote Skin to Skin in the OR

# **Hospital Overview**



- Huntsville Hospital Women and Children's
- Located in Huntsville, AL
- Level 3 Regional Neonatal ICU serving all of North Alabama
- 55 bed unit that regularly houses 70-90 infants on any given day
- Care for infants born as early as 22 weeks gestation
- Care for infants needing general surgeries





- 2013 Hypothermia on admission of smallest babies correlated to poor outcomes. Golden Hour implemented.
- 2015 Small Baby Group began
- Survival rates have steadily increased each year since 2015
  - 2015 64 small babies and 22 deaths in that population 66% survival
  - 2023 84 small babies and 14 deaths in that population 83% survival

#### **Neonatal Hypothermia Prevention Data**



- Small Baby Guidelines
  - Increasing delivery room temperature
  - Use of a pre-warmed radiant warmer or Omni Bed
  - Polyethylene Bag
  - Hat
  - Thermal mattress for infants

#### Successes



- Expanded our guidelines for admission temperatures to include up to 32 week gestation.
  - For infants < or = 32 weeks gestation, the following are to be utilized to prevent Hypothermia:
    - Increasing delivery room temperature
    - Use of a pre-warmed radiant warmer or Omni Bed
    - Polyethylene Bag
    - Hat
    - Thermal mattress for infants < 28 weeks gestation</li>
- Provided guidelines for keeping these infants warm in delivery and through admission.
- Latest data shows infants born at less that 32 weeks consistently have an admission temperature WNL

## **Challenges & Barriers**

AIPQC

- Working with multiple areas of practice
- Charting issues who charts what?
- Delayed cord clamping how long is delayed?

### **Opportunities**



- Continue to work toward better recording of DCC
- Would like to start working toward better temperature control in outlying hospitals for smallest infants as well as throughout transport.
