Workshop Overview:

Pavement, curbs, sidewalk, curb ramps, signs, pavement markings, street lighting, storm drainage, and shade trees are full of their own terminology that is often mystifying – unnecessarily so. What exactly is under the pavement that makes it fail? Is salt really the reason your concrete fails? What are the rules for signs and markings? How are speed limits established? Should you try pavement preservation or just let it degrade and then mill and pave it? We aim to remove the mystery. We will explore these with a light touch to introduce and orient you and then, in if you want to get further into the weeds, we'll point you to other training workshops we offer and those you can find elsewhere, along with links to resources you can use in the future.

Target Audience: This is a non-technical to low-technical introduction for those new to local government or public works. Ideal for elected officials, city managers, clerks, and newer public works personnel. All are welcome. No mathematics and no quizzes – it's an easy morning.
