LEAD Camp Overview

The Sino-American Youth LEAD Camp invites American students from SWUFE's partner institutions in the United States to participate in a 10-day study and research exchange in Chengdu, commencing January 6, 2025. During their stay, participants will have the opportunity to experience Chinese higher education, visit cultural landmarks, and explore distinguished Chinese enterprises. This program aims to provide a comprehensive immersion into Chinese academic life and cultural heritage, fostering mutual understanding and friendship between young leaders from both countries.





Background

The Sino-American Youth LEAD Camp at the Southwestern University of Finance and Economics (SWUFE) is part of the "Young Envoys Scholarship" initiative by the Chinese Ministry of Education, which aims to invite 50,000 American youth to China over five years. This program deepens mutual understanding and friendship between young people from China and the U.S., providing a platform to experience Chinese culture, especially Sichuanese culture. It also showcases China's technological and business innovations and enhances academic dialogue in economics and finance between SWUFE and its partner institutions.





LEAD Camp Highlights

1 Diversified Cultural Exchange and Experience

Students can experience traditional Chinese culture, such as calligraphy, tea ceremony, and paper-cutting, visit cultural sites, and explore the specialties of Chengdu, such as Sichuan Opera face-changing and Sichuan cuisine.

2 Academic exchanges in the field of finance and economics



Academic Experience

The academic experience within the Sino-American Youth LEAD Camp at SWUFE features specialized lectures conducted by experienced faculty on critical topics such as the Chinese economy, new forms of productivity, China's financial markets, and the Belt and Road Initiative. Participants gain insights through these lectures and by visiting the university's advanced financial laboratories and innovation centers, combining theoretical knowledge with practical applications. This enriched academic engagement deepens the understanding of China's economic and financial landscape and facilitates intellectual exchange between the participating institutions.

Cultural Experience



The cultural experience component of the Sino-American Youth LEAD Camp at SWUFE offers hands-on workshops in traditional Chinese arts such as calligraphy, tea ceremony, paper-cutting, martial arts, and Tai Chi. Participants will also delve into the unique culture of Sichuan through visits to significant locations like Zhanqi Village, the Panda Base, the Sanxingdui Museum, the Jinsha Site, Wuhou Temple, and Du Fu Thatched Cottage. These activities provide a comprehensive immersion into both traditional Chinese culture and the rich heritage of the Sichuan region.

Corporate Visits

The corporate visit component of the Sino-American Youth LEAD Camp includes site visits to prominent Chinese enterprises such as JD Logistics, iFlytek, and FAW-Volkswagen. These visits offer participants a behind-the-scenes look at the operational dynamics, technological innovations, and market strategies of leading companies in China. Through these visits, students gain valuable insights into the business environment and the practices that drive success in the Chinese market.

Eligible Applicants

American students from the University of Delaware, Baruch College of the City University of New York, and Rutgers University.

Program Costs

The program fees and accommodation costs will be covered by Southwestern University of Finance and Economics (SWUFE). American participants are responsible for their own international travel and personal expenses.

November 10, 2024

Interested students should apply through the responsible staff or faculty at their respective universities. Each university will then submit a consolidated list of applicants to Southwestern University of Finance and Economics.
