## **Status of Wilmington Public Education**



As of 2015, there are 23 governing units that serve 11,595 Wilmington students in the public school system. On virtually every indicator (academic performance, drop-out rates, and graduation rates), Wilmington students perform at a lower level than non-Wilmington students, including low-income students.
