

Redding Consortium Schools Scholarship



- **Scholarships will be available for the 2023-2024 academic year.**
- Eligible employees or student teachers who are currently working at a Redding Consortium school can apply to receive a scholarship towards tuition and mandatory fees at a Delaware Institution of Higher Education.
 - **Individuals who are actively enrolled or planning to enroll in summer, fall, winter or spring can apply.**
- **Eligible employees** include teachers, para educators, student teachers, principals, nurses, counselors, social workers, and other education support staff in a Redding Consortium school.



Updated Scholarship Eligibility Parameters

- **Associate, bachelors, masters, certificate, and advanced credentialing programs are eligible.**
 - There is no minimum number of credits that an eligible employee must be enrolled in to qualify for this scholarship.
- **Eligible programs of study include:**
 - Educator Prep/ARTC
 - Bachelors or associate in education
 - Education Leadership at the masters or certificate level
 - Mental Health Professionals/Speech-Language Pathologists/Occupational Therapy/School Nurses

Background & Vision

Over the past several years, the SDWG efforts have focused on early care and K-5 education

- The Work Group Co-chairs are interested in:
 - **Expanding the focus for wraparound services to middle and high school students** through development of a comprehensive plan to support the needs of middle and high school students from the City of Wilmington and northern New Castle County, Delaware.
- The approach for supporting middle and high school wraparound services will be two-fold:
 - **Short-term:** There are available Redding funds that could be put towards wraparound services this year; these funds could be used to support the Boost Initiative. (Boost is a four-district cross collaboration to improve the high school graduation success rate for Wilmington students).
 - **Long-term:** Develop a sustainable, collaborative strategy for supporting wraparound services for secondary education including districts, charters, vo-techs, and WLC alignment.

Wraparound Services for Middle School and High School Students

The Social Determinants Work Group approved the vote on May 22, 2023 for the following item:

"Approve the use of funds from the Redding Consortium budget allocated for the wraparound services to support high school students in the City of Wilmington through the Boost Initiative for the next 3 years."
