# Persons with Disabilities in Delaware







### **Adults with Disability**

In 2022, 1 in 4 Delaware adults reported having at least one disability\*\* on the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS). Cognitive and mobility disabilities were the most common types.



### **Aging and Disability**

The American Community Survey estimates that more than 1 in 5

Delawareans aged 65-74 has a disability. This rate almost doubles to 42.8% among people aged 75 and over (2018-2022).




## Disability and Mental Health

In 2023, Delaware 8th graders with a disability reported approximately 3x the rate of recent feelings of anxiety (43%) compared to students without a disability. More than 1 in 3 students with a disability reported recent feelings of depression.

\*Disability in the DSS refers to serious difficulty hearing or seeing, walking or climbing stairs, or having difficulty concentrating, remembering, making decisions, or doing things because of a physical, emotional, or learning disability. This includes both self-identified and medical-professional identified.


\*\*Adults with disabilities are defined by the ACS and BRFSS as experiencing functional difficulty in at least one of six areas: hearing, vision, cognitive, ambulatory, self-care, or independent living.






In 2023, 8th and 11th grade students with a disability\* were more likely to report using alcohol in the past year compared to students without disabilities.

#### **Behavioral Health and Disability Status: Adults (%)**







In 2022, adults with disabilities have **higher rates of smoking, binge drinking, and depression** than adults without reported disabilities.
