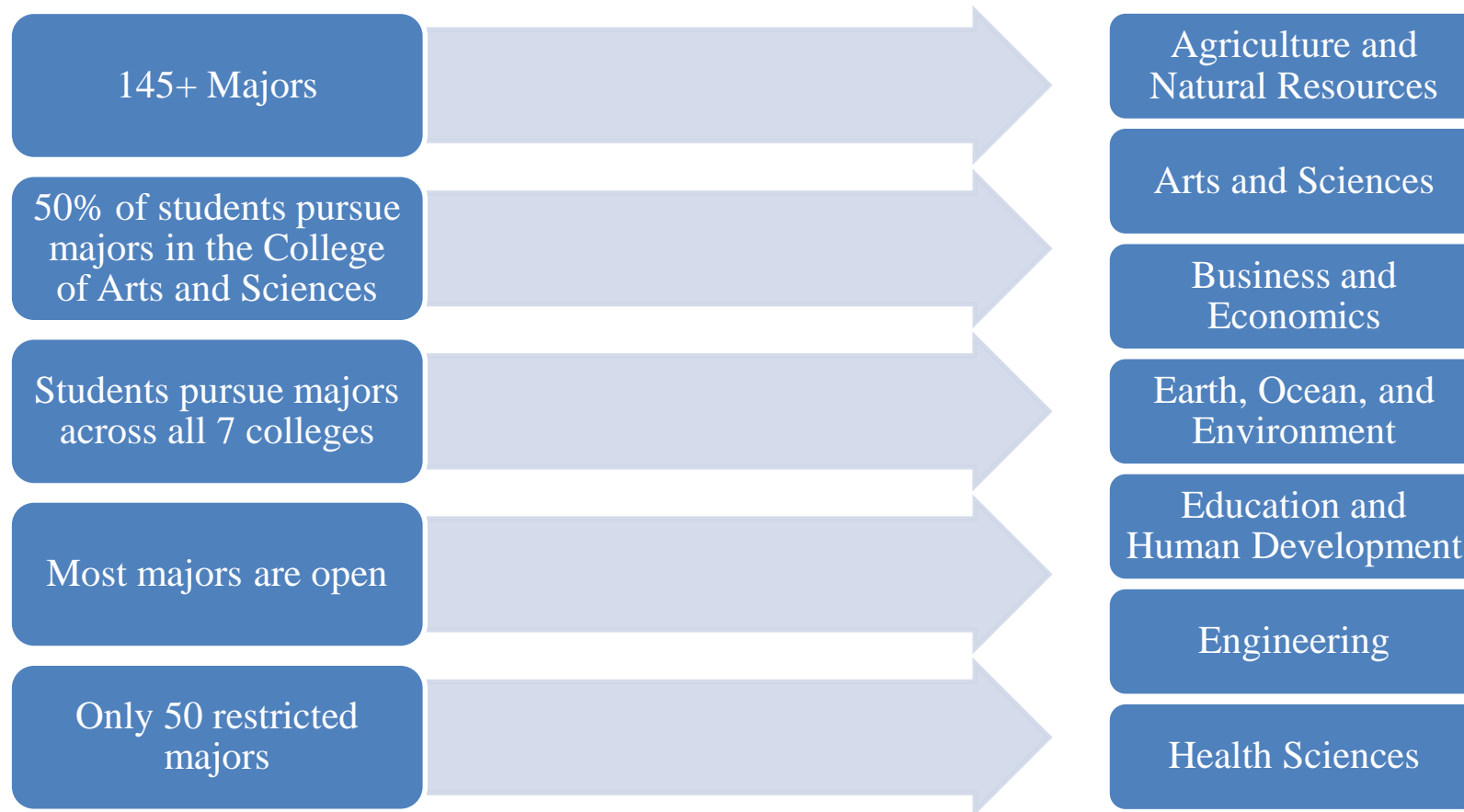

What classes can I take toward my intended major?

History

University and College Requirements (except Discovery Learning Experience, Capstone, and Second Writing Requirement completed in AAP)

Major Requirements (30 credits in history minimum; 45 credits maximum)

- HIST101: Western Civilization or HIST 103: World History I (AAP) – 3 credits
- HIST102: Western Civilization 1648 to present or HIST 104: World History II (AAP) - 3 credits
- HIST268 – 3 credits
- Course in Asian, African, Latin American, or Middle Eastern History (AAP)– 3 credits
- History course before 1700 – 3 credits
- History courses at or above 300 level – 12 credits
- History seminar at the 400 level or above – 3 credits

***Minimum 124 credits**

Marketing

University Requirements – 9 credits (except DLE)

University Breadth Requirements – 12 credits

Major Requirements

- Additional breadth requirements – 6 credits
- Social and Behavioral Sciences – 12 credits
