



# What classes can I take toward my intended major?



### History

University and College Requirements (except Discovery Learning Experience, Capstone, and Second Writing Requirement completed in AAP)

Major Requirements (30 credits in history minimum; 45 credits maximum)

- HIST101: Western Civilization or HIST 103: World History I (AAP) 3 credits
- HIST102: Western Civilization 1648 to present or HIST 104: World History II (AAP) 3 credits
- HIST268 3 credits
- Course in Asian, African, Latin American, or Middle Eastern History (AAP)- 3 credits
- History course before 1700 3 credits
- History courses at or above 300 level 12 credits
- History seminar at the 400 level or above 3 credits

#### \*Minimum 124 credits
