What Does Undeclared Mean?

- A student admitted to college who has yet to declare the major from which they will eventually graduate
- Some colleges and universities call these students...
 - "Undeclared" or "Undecided"
 - "Exploratory"
 - "Students-in-transition"
- At the University of Delaware, these students are called:

University Studies Students or UST students





Being Undeclared:

MYTHS VERSUS REALITY





Myth: Undeclared students take a bunch of classes that "don't count towards anything."

Reality: Our advisors are professionally trained to ensure that every class a student enrolls in counts towards particular requirements (university, college, major).


- We use a variety of methods to determine the most widely applicable classes students can take.
- Advisors can run audits and reports to determine how courses can fulfill different requirements.





Myth: Students who are undeclared lack direction and are poor decision makers.

Reality: Research shows that students who face the obstacle of determining a major but show a strong commitment to exploring/investigating are more likely to succeed.



Being undeclared does not make a poor decision maker; the inability to adapt or commit causes indecision.

Myth: Most majors will not accept undeclared students.

Reality: UST students have been accepted into **every** college on campus.

Entrance into restricted majors is contingent on successful performance in required classes, e.g. high level math. These classes are open to all students, including UST.







Myth: Undeclared students enter with lower scores and are less academically prepared.

Reality: NOPE.

- > Students who entered UD as UST in Fall 2021:
 - ✓ 94% had high school GPAs of 3.0 or higher
 - √ 65% had high school GPAs of 3.5 or higher
- Among all majors at UD, UST had the 5th highest number of incoming first year Honors students.

What is University Studies?

Our mission

➤ To enhance and support the educational experiences of those admitted to the University of Delaware who have yet to declare a major or are in transition from one major to another

Our goal

➤ To ensure our students are given the chance to explore their interests and work closely with them to create an individualized plan to identify and declare their major



- > (3 credits) ENGL 110: Seminar in Composition
- ➤ (0 4 credits) First Year Experience (Seminar)
- > (3 credits) Multicultural Course
- > (3 credits) **Discovery Learning Experience**
- > (variable credits) Capstone Experience
- (12 credits) University Breadth Requirements





University Breadth Requirements

All students must complete one class from each category below to satisfy University of Delaware requirements. This provides opportunities for students to explore disciplines, while satisfying requirements towards graduation.

- Creative Arts and Humanities
- ➤ History and Cultural Change
- > Social and Behavioral Sciences
- ➤ Mathematics, Natural Science, and Technology





Majors


There are over 160 majors available at UD within our 8 colleges and schools.

UD students can choose the type of academic plan that suits them:

- > Single major
- Major with a minor(s)
- Double major
- > Interdepartmental major
- Double degree

UST students are expected to declare a major by the time they reach 60 credits.

Academic Planning



UST advisors work with students to enroll in appropriate classes for their major(s) of interest, help them incorporate study abroad plans when choosing classes, and discuss how various academic programs including double majors and minors might be accomplished during their time at UD.

UST students participate in programs such as: Honors, World Scholars, Delaware Innovation Fellows, Cybersecurity Scholars, and Community Engagement Scholars.



Workshops & Courses

Academic workshops offered by our professional advisors give students practical information to help them understand academic policies, the UD curriculum, and major exploration.

UNIV117: Exploring Your Academic Path

UST Spring Seminar that combines self-exploration, academic resources, engaging discussions, and activities to provide students with a greater understanding of the components that may lead to their success academically and professionally.





Partnerships across Campus



University Studies is conveniently located in the Center for Academic Success, which includes the Drop-In Tutoring Center. We also collaborate with other departments on campus including:

- The Career Center
- Other Colleges and Advisors
- Office of the Dean of Students
- Disability Support Services
- Student Diversity & Inclusion



Individualized Professional Advising

UST has six dedicated advisors with a variety of educational backgrounds and professional experiences. They are knowledgeable about UD's curriculum and collaborate with the other colleges.

Each student in UST is assigned to a professional academic advisor, who is available to meet with in-person or by phone or answer questions through e-mail.

Advising appointments focus on student development, academic planning, major exploration and more.





Peer Liaisons

The UST Peer Liaisons is a structured network of current and former UST students with identified majors. They volunteer to share their journey in transitioning to college and finding their major.

Peer Liaisons work closely with UST Advisors to host social and academic programming tailored to helping students explore majors and engage in experiential learning.
