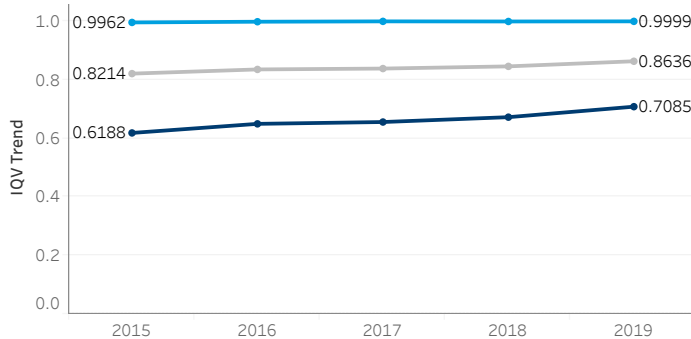

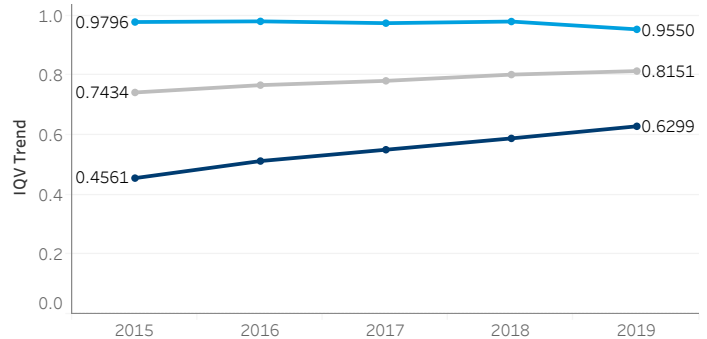

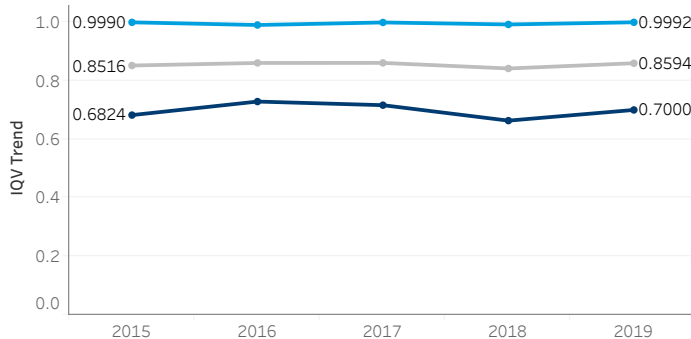
Total AA Students IQV<sup>2</sup> Trend



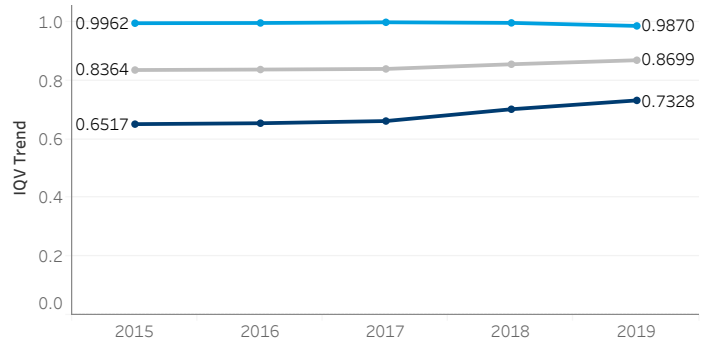
AA Georgetown Students IQV<sup>2</sup> Trend

<sup>2</sup>The index of qualitative variation (IQV) is a measure of variability. IQV value varies between 0 and 1, with 0 indicating no variability at all, and 1 indicating perfect variation-cases evenly divided across all categories. In other words, the closer the IQV value is to 1, the more diverse the student population is with regard to race, gender, or the gender/race combination. Unknown race and Unreported gender categories are excluded from the computation of the IQV.
