**Duplicated Enrollment:** Counts reflect the actual number of persons being served by college, without regard to the number of majors or composition of majors across college. Because students may simultaneously be enrolled in multiple majors across colleges, the sum of college enrollment counts may be greater than the university unduplicated headcount.

**Prorated Enrollment:** All students who are enrolled in majors in multiple colleges are prorated as a proportion of the number of concurrently enrolled majors in each college for budgetary purposes. The sum of the college prorated counts will equal the University unduplicated headcount.

**Note:** In 2020, the Graduate College was created, and the Joseph R. Biden, Jr. School of Public Policy & Administration moved out of the College of Arts & Sciences to be a stand-alone college.
