INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM

Courses in our Intensive English Program (IEP) help students prepare for undergraduate or graduate studies at an American university, business professionals learn English for career enhancement and general language learners improve their language skills.

Levels of instruction

On your first day, you will take an entrance assessment to help us determine your English level. You should complete one level per two-month session.

You will be placed in one of seven (7) levels of instruction that works best for your proficiency.

Note: the Basic level may not be offered each session.

Areas of study

Beginner and Intermediate Levels

At the beginner and intermediate levels (Basic, 1, 2, 3), students study general English in their Listening/Speaking and Reading/Writing courses.

High Intermediate and Advanced Levels

At the high intermediate and advanced levels (4, 5, 6), students choose from innovative courses in one of the following four areas of study:



Coursework

ELI students attend two (2) courses each day:

- · Listening/Speaking: Develop oral grammar, pronunciation, intonation, accent and listening comprehension skills.
- Reading/Writing: Develop reading, writing, vocabulary and research skills.

Each class meets for two hours each day, Monday-Friday. Students also benefit from additional hours of flexible study in private tutoring, listening laboratory and optional programs in The Hub for up to 28 hours of instruction.

ACADEMIC TRANSITIONS

Conditional admissions for undergraduate students

Academic Transitions (AT) is UD's pathway program for conditionally-admitted undergraduate students. Improve your academic English before starting full-time US university studies. With small class sizes, and support designed for English learners, AT is a great way to begin your journey as a Blue Hen! Students can study all majors via AT.

Features of AT

Courses related to the student's major

AT students follow a special track of study with courses and credits that count toward their bachelor's degree. You can **earn up to 28 credits** while studying at the ELI—almost the equivalent of the first year of university—which helps you **finish in 4 years**!

Classes for English learners

University courses taken in AT provide the same content as typical University courses, but have been designed for students whose first language is not English. This helps students to better understand the course content.

Academic skill development

AT students develop study skills, build academic vocabulary, and learn about the expectations of American professors. Most AT students (90%) matriculate after two semesters, and **earn a higher GPA** than international students who did not complete AT.

Resources for student success

Whether studying online or on campus, AT students have many resources to help them be successful: University student and faculty mentors, academic advisors, private tutoring and more.

Excellent value

AT students pay a similar price to what other international students pay for one year of full-time university study; however, AT students receive added value in the support that was specially designed for non-native English speakers.

Online option

Students can begin their AT experience taking **small**, **online classes**. Classes are mostly live, with students and instructors interacting "face-to-face," virtually. Breakout rooms provide space for small group work.

Genuine university experience

The full college experience happens outside of the classroom. AT students join student clubs, participate in campus life, and share their culture with others! Virtual student life events are held several times a week, allowing online students to join in the fun!

Convenient start dates

The AT calendar uses 4-month semesters. There are 3 start dates for AT each year.






How does AT work?

There are two paths that determine how many university credits you can earn in AT, and how much time you will spend in the program:

- AT1 + AT2: earn up to 16 credits in 8 months.
- Plus AT3 option: earn up to 28 credits in 12 months.

All students are automatically enrolled in the AT1 + AT2 plan, with the expectation that they will complete the program in 8 months. In the Plus AT3 option, you continue studying in AT3 for an additional 4 months after completing AT2. AT3 is a chance to earn more credits at a discounted rate.



AT Calendar

There are 3 semesters of AT offered each year, and you can start your studies at the ELI at the beginning of any of these terms.

Each semester lasts approximately 4 months.

GRADUATE CONDITIONAL ADMISSIONS

Through the Graduate Conditional Admissions Program (Grad CAP), excellent students can be accepted to UD graduate programs and to our partner colleges and universities.

No TOEFL score is required!

Grad CAP prepares students for rigorous study in an American graduate program. Students develop academic teamwork, research and leadership skills while improving their academic English skills. Grad CAP provides a seamless transition to full-time graduate study in the U.S.

- 7 levels of instruction in Academic English, Listening/Speaking and Reading/Writing

Program Duration

The length of time needed to complete Grad CAP requirements is different for each student. It depends on a few factors, including:



Program Duration

HOUSING

Where can you live during your stay at the ELI?

We are happy to help you find a place to live while you are studying in Delaware. Several housing options are already available; however, the type of housing that you can choose may depend on your ELI program.

- 1. RESIDENCE HALLS Academic
 Transitions students may have the
 option to live on campus in the
 University of Delaware residence
 halls (dormitories). The rooms are
 comfortable, furnished and airconditioned. By living on campus, you
 can experience college living just like
 an American student. Staff is available
 to help with problems and arrange
 cultural programming.
- 2. HOMESTAY You can live with an American family. The ELI Homestay Coordinator finds hosts who are interested in having international students live in their homes. During your stay there, you will join in on outings, traditions and daily tasks.
- 3. APARTMENT Live off-campus in an apartment in Newark. Some students may choose to live in the Global Community at The Waverly. Most apartments are within biking distance of campus and the ELI, or you can take the University's free shuttle bus to travel between campus and your apartment.
- 4. INNternationale The
 INNternationale is a residential and
 conference facility for international
 students, visiting professors and UD
 students interested in international
 living. ELI students who live in the
 INNternationale normally are mature

professionals who are studying at the

ELI for a short period of time.
