

Produce Safety Rule 101

The Basics

- Went into effect January 26, 2016
- 1 of 7 rules under the Food Safety Modernization Act
- The Produce Safety rule establishes, for the first time, science-based minimum standards for the safe growing, harvesting, packing, and holding of fruits and vegetables grown for human consumption.
- First time there have been regulatory inspections on covered farms
- Covered Farms Include: Growers who produce more than \$25,000 annually of generally consumed raw produce

Inspections have started for all farms covered under this regulation.



Produce Safety Authority in DE



Primary authority: FDA

• Use FDA forms and procedures

Secondary Authority: DE Admin Code 302: Produce Safety Regulations

- Regulations went into effect in June 2019 and amended in August 2021
- Establish:
 - Authority to operate in DE under both FDA and State Authority
 - Inspections, Record Requests and Review
 - Mandatory Registration
 - Violation/Hearing Procedures and Penalties

Then and Now: Regulation Amendments

2019

DDA will require that all farms within Delaware that **grow** produce register with the Department of Agriculture



2021

DDA will require that all farms within Delaware that grow, harvest, pack, or hold produce intended for human consumption and for sale, register with the Department of Agriculture.

Registration Deadline: April 30th (Annually)

Registration is mandatory regardless of exemption status
Online Registration Portal is live

Online Registration Portal

New way to submit new registration, update existing information and apply for exemptions

Benefits:

- Automatic email communications (reminders, updates, etc)
- Provides option to fill out forms by paper
- Allows for the attachment of supplemental materials needed for exemptions

This portal will serve as a way for farms/businesses operating in Delaware to submit their annual registration, update information, and apply for exemptions (if eligible). More information on registration and exemptions can be found below.

Mandatory Registration Information


As of 2019, the Delaware Department of Agriculture has made it mandatory through State regulations (Produce Safety Regulations 302 Del. Code. § 3.0) that all farms within Delaware that grow, harvest, pack, or hold produce intended for human consumption and for sale, register with the Delaware Department of Agriculture by April 30th, annually.

This mandatory registration processes is intended to verify who is and who is not covered under the <u>Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA)</u>: <u>Produce Safety Rule (21 CFR 112)</u>. This process allows us to provide valuable education, technical assistance, and compliance information to regulated farms and businesses, exclude farms that are not required to comply with the rule, and prioritize inspections.

Exemption Information

The Delaware Department of Agriculture is also awarding exemption certifications by exemption type as outlined in the Produce Safety Rule. Since farm information changes from year to

Exemption Type Review/Recap

Exempt

- Only grow produce considered Rarely Consumed Raw
- Produce is grown only for personal consumption
- Under \$25,000 in average annual produce sales

Covered

- Large Farms (\$500,000+ in average annual produce sales)
- Small Farms (\$250,000 \$500,000 in average annual produce sales)
- Very Small Farms (\$25,000 \$250,000 in average annual produce sales)

Exemptions Recap: "Covered Farms"

Large Farm (\$500,000+ in average annual produce sales)

Eligible Farms: Those between \$25,000 - \$500,000 in average annual produce sales

Both requirements must be met

- A. During the previous 3-year period, annual <u>food</u>* sales are less than \$500,000 (adjusted for inflation)
- B. 51% or more of your annual <u>food</u> sales are to qualified end-users
 - a. Qualified End- User:
 - i. The consumer of the food
 - ii. Restaurant or Retail food establishment located in Delaware
 - iii. Restaurant or Retail Food Establishment that is located no more than 275 miles from the farm that produced the food


Processing Exemption



Covered farms are eligible when produce grown receives commercial processing that adequately reduces the presence of microorganisms of public health significance.

➤ If eligible for this exemption, you must follow the modified requirements outlined in the rule.

Tool: DDA Exemption Determination





Will be available from within the Grower Portal

Exemption Certificates

- Awarded for ALL eligible registered farms based on their exemption types
- Issued annually and expire April 30th of the following year
- Once approved in the registration portal, the certificate will be automatically sent.
- Deadline for exemption applications: April 30th

"How often will I be Inspected?"

Fully covered farms will receive annual Inspections

2022-2023: UD Cooperative Extension

MOU with University of Delaware Cooperative Extension:



- Assists on On-Farm Readiness Reviews:
 - Confidential, free, "risk-assessment" of growing facilities to prepare farmers for what to expect during a regulatory inspection and designed to help growers mitigate potential risk areas.

Upcoming Training Opportunities

- Produce Safety Alliance Grower Training (PSA Training)
 - Wednesday, January 25th
 - University of Delaware Carvel Research and Education Center
 - Registration Required (Eventbrite)
 - If covered under the Produce Safety Rule, at least one person of supervisory authority <u>must take</u> a PSA Grower Training.
 - The training is open to everyone
 - One-time, all-day course
 - Certificate awarded upon competition of course



No Changes made to Harvest and Post Harvest Water



Safe and of adequate sanitary quality for its intended use

No detectable generic E. coli per 100 ml



Farms must inspect & Maintain water systems that are under their control

At least annually



Maintain records of water sanitation & Inspections/ maintenance

Harvest and Post Harvest Water

Enforcement discretion ends:

- January 26, 2025, Very Small Farms
 - \$25,000 \$250,000 in average annual produce sales
- January 26, 2024, Small Farms
 - \$250,000 \$500,000 in average annual produce sales
- January 26, 2023, Large Farms
 - \$500,000+ in average annual produce sales



Pre-Harvest water

- The proposed regulatory update has not been finalized yet for covered produce (excluding sprouts)
- Proposed rule
 - Would remove the pre-harvest microbial quality criteria and testing requirements, and Replace them with requirements for systems-based preharvest agricultural water assessments
