



## Brambles - Rubus sp.

- Many wild or naturalized types
  - Wild black raspberry (lowland)
  - Wild red raspberry (mountains)
  - Wild blackberries
  - Naturalized wineberries





#### **Bramble Flowers & Fruit**


- Brambles are self-pollinating but benefit from bee pollination
- Fruits are an aggregate fruit of drupelets – I seed per drupelet
- Raspberries separate from the receptacle, blackberries do not





#### **Bramble Plants**

- Canes (stems) live for 2 years
  - Year I cane = Primocane
  - Year 2 cane = Floricane
- All varieties fruit on floricanes, some will also fruit on primocanes
- Floricane fruit produced in summer
- Primocane fruit produced in fall
- Floricane fruit production requires selective pruning
- Plants for primocane fruit production are just mowed/ cut off in winter.

Blackberry hybrids of multiple species	Yes	Yes	Yes	Yes












### **Bramble Sites**

• Site away from wild brambles




Virus symptoms



### **Bramble Sites**

 Southern exposure may increase chance of winter injury.

# **Site Preparation**

- Well drained soils are best for brambles
  - If prone to wetness, raise beds and/or increase organic matter
- 3%+ organic matter preferred. Add organic soil amendments, such as compost or incorporate cover crops.
- Adjust pH to 6.0-6.5







#### **Bramble Establishment**

- Planting Dates
  - Plant dormant plants in March/April
  - Plant rooted plants in May
- In-row spacing
  - Red/yellow raspberries 24"
  - Purple raspberries 36"
  - Black raspberries 30"
  - Blackberries 48-72"
- Between-row spacing
  - 8-12'
- Plant at nursery depth
- Plantings can last 8+ years, remove if vigor wanes (virus, root disease)



## **Obtaining Bramble Plants**

- Purchase plants from a <u>reputable</u> nursery
  - True to name
  - Disease free
  - Virus indexed
- Don't plant "shared" plants
- Arrange for a proper delivery date

## **Red & Yellow Raspberries**

- Temperature optimum is 70°F
- Some red varieties tolerate hot weather, but yellow raspberries are not very heat tolerant.

# **Purple Raspberries**


- Very vigorous and productive

- Flavor is suboptimal





- Tolerates warmer temperatures
- Tolerates (enjoys?) some shade
- Short harvest season
- Limited cultivars





- Tolerate high temperatures
- Very vigorous and productive
- Least cold tolerant


# **Pruning and Training Red Raspberries**

#### Floricane Cultivars

- Summer
  - Remove spent floricanes after fruiting
- Dormant
  - Reduce row to I ft wide
  - Remove weak/damaged canes
  - Thin canes to 4-6/ft of row
  - Shorten canes to desired level

#### **Primocane Cultivars**

- Dormant
  - Mow or cut all canes to ~3"





## Pruning and Training Black & Purple Raspberries

#### Floricane Cultivars

- Summer
  - Remove spent floricanes after fruiting
  - Top primocanes at 3-4'
  - Tie primocanes to one side of trellis
- Dormant
  - Remove weak/damaged canes
  - Thin to 5-10 canes per plant
  - Cut laterals to 6"
  - Remove low laterals

#### **Primocane Cultivars**

- Dormant
  - Mow or cut all canes to ~3"



## **Pruning and Training Blackberries**

#### Floricane Cultivars

- Summer
  - Remove spent floricanes after fruiting
  - Top primocanes at 5'
- Dormant
  - Remove weak/damaged canes
  - Thin canes to 6-8 per yard
  - Cut laterals to 12"

#### **Primocane Cultivars**

- Dormant
  - Mow or cut all canes to ~3"
