Center for Human Rights, Gender and Migration: 2024 Seed Grant

Call for Proposals

Seed Grants: \$2,500- \$5,000

Application Opens: April 26, 2024

Deadline: May 27, 2024

Overview

The Center for Human Rights, Gender and Migration (CHGRM) is providing four seed grants of \$5,000 each to junior faculty and two seed grants of \$2,500 each to graduate students. These grants will be for projects geared towards the Center's initiatives. With these seed grants, we hope to support junior faculty and graduate students dedicated to conducting research within the intersection of human rights, gender, and migration. Preference will be given to projects that foster and support ethical and meaningful collaborations between partners outside the US or Europe.

Funding/ Award Details

Seed grants are available to support junior faculty and graduate/PhD student research responsive to this call. We anticipate funding four proposals for junior faculty at **\$5,000** each and two proposals for graduate students at **\$2,500** each to support for twelve (12) months.

Eligibility

- The principal investigator must either have a faculty appointment at Washington University in St. Louis, with priority given to junior faculty **or** be actively enrolled as a Graduate or PhD Student.
- Research projects must be related to the CHGRM and fall within the intersection of Human Rights, Gender and Migration.
 - Priority will be given to work involving meaningful collaboration with partners outside the US or Europe.
 - Priority will be given to work that collaborates with local researchers and affected communities.
- Project must have the ability to develop into a larger project and/or become actionable (i.e. tool development, policy brief, etc.)

Deadline and Requirements

The application period opens on April 26, 2024. All proposals must be submitted by email to centerforhumanrights@wustl.edu by 5pm (CST) on **May 27, 2024**, with “[LAST NAME] - Seed Grant Proposal- Submission 2024” in the subject line. You will receive confirmation of the receipt of your materials within one business day. Decisions will be made by June 7, 2024.

Proposals must be a single PDF file including the following:

- **Applicant information:**
 - Principal investigator’s name
 - Academic title
 - School
 - Email
 - Please list any co-investigator(s) name and contact information.
 - **International collaborator’s information:** name, title, organization, and email.
 - **Title and abstract:** The abstract is limited to 150 words.
 - **Description:** Write a maximum of 1,000 words detailing the research and purpose. Specify what problem the project is addressing and how it intersects with human rights, gender, and migration. Include information on the study methods and design and whether this project will involve human subjects. If it does, you must provide an IRB approval number.
 - **Budget:** include the dollar amount for which you are applying. Detail how the funds will be used with a budget and budget justification. Please note the unallowable costs listed below:
 - Salary
 - Conference Travel
 - Equipment purchases over \$200
- * Please include a copy of your budget in an Excel file.

Post Award Requirements

- Notify CHRGM of your acceptance of the award and provide a brief blurb of your project for center publications.
- You will present your research outcomes to relevant stakeholders by September 2025.
- Complete a brief post-award CHRGM survey or interview by September 2025.
