We would like to highlight Dr. Katie Schultz's upcoming webinar sponsored by the National Institutes of Health's Health Disparities Interest Group and National Institute for Child Health and Development Division of Intramural Research Joint Lecture. Her talk is titled, "Strengths, Community, and Frameworks to Advance American Indian and Alaska Native Health Equity," and will be on Tuesday, March 14, 2023 from 10:30-11:30 a.m. EST. We would also like to congratulate CMHSR Assistant Director Dr. Morgan Shields, whose [work was recently featured on NPR](#). The story highlighted the impact that Dr. Shields' work has had at the federal level, contributing to a new law that now mandates that the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services start systematically collecting and reporting patient experience data related to inpatient psychiatry. Until now, psychiatric patients were the only adult patients excluded from national measurement of patient experience, which Dr. Shields describes as discrimination. These data have the promise of orienting providers towards patient-centeredness in a setting where there are significant power imbalances and vulnerabilities, and can improve accountability, payment, and research capacity. Katie Schultz, MSW, PhD (she/her) is a citizen of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma and an Assistant Professor of Social Work at the University of Michigan with a research focus on health equity among American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) populations. Drawing on community-based participatory research approaches, she focuses primarily on responding to violence and understanding community and cultural connectedness in AI/AN communities.

She is interested in innovative conceptual and methodological approaches to research with tribal communities and health promotion rooted in Indigenous knowledges and sustainable solutions by and for Native peoples. Active projects include a study focused on identifying risk pathways and correlates associated with lowered recidivism among AI/AN individuals with involvement in criminal legal systems in Alaska (NIDA; R21DA050518); investigating social networks among American Indian adolescents and associations with substance use, violence, and suicide (NIDA; R21DA053789); and collaborating with a statewide coalition to describe the use of culturally-honoring services in tribal advocacy programs in Michigan.
