Details

The Experience

- The 2021 program will be entirely virtual due to pandemic conditions. The expectation is that participants will attend all 9 sessions
- Each participant will work on a team project throughout the program
- Sessions are comprised of two half-day sessions: Fridays 1:00-4:00 pm and Saturdays 9:00 am – 12:00 pm.

Learning Objectives

- Enhance participant knowledge of the vocabulary, concepts, and strategies that are fundamental for success in a leadership role in academic medicine and health care
- Encourage cross-functional thinking and teamwork through exploring both informal leadership and leadership style
- Advance personal leadership effectiveness and management capacity through proficiency in nine key areas (See our Session Schedule on next page)

All applications must include the application form (signed by department chair/program director/hospital administrator), a curriculum vitae (CV) and applicant letter of intent.
