Their community engagement, racial equity, and entrepreneur support initiatives engage and empower professionals, entrepreneurs, and community leaders that are underprivileged and often underestimated and serve a network of over 1,700 changemakers, entrepreneurs, leaders and organizations in the St. Louis metropolitan region.

Natalie Self brings an extensive background in building a more equitable St. Louis through cross-sector collective leadership, operationalizing equity frameworks for regional change, and national grant-making.

Most immediately prior to this role, Natalie served as a Program Officer in Entrepreneurship at the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation, where she managed a national grant portfolio totaling more than \$24M in investments made to organizations implementing novel approaches to supporting entrepreneurs from communities systemically left behind. In this role, she facilitated diversity, equity, and inclusion learning conversations with 34 member foundations of the national Entrepreneurship Funders Network.

Prior to her work at Kauffman, Natalie served as a Program Manager at BioSTL, where she was responsible for the operations and evaluation of the BioSTL Inclusion Initiative. In this role, Natalie also drafted the framework we used to launch STEMSTL. She also founded the <u>St. Louis</u> <u>Equity in Entrepreneurship Collective</u>.
