RECYCLE

Always remember to reduce and reuse first.

Uncontaminated containers (triple rinse & deface)

Plastic containers #1-5

Cardboard (flatten large boxes)

Glove boxes

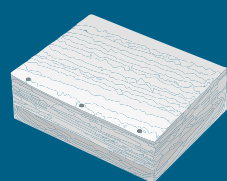
Paper

Foil

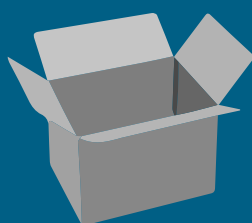
Pipette tip boxes and racks

Steel/aluminum outer can (4 liters or less)

Non-hazardous large tubes/vials ($\geq 25\text{mL}$)



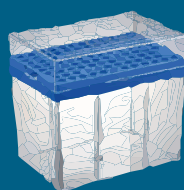

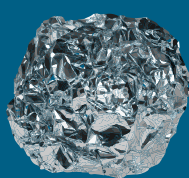

DO NOT RECYCLE

Containers that held:

- P-Listed Materials
- Select Agent Toxins
- Controlled Substances
- Highly Toxic Chemicals
- Pyrophoric Materials
- Odiferous chemicals
- Radioactive chemical
- Infectious/Biological

Tempered/coated glass

Sharps

Syringes (with or without needles)

Pipette tips

Small vials and tubes

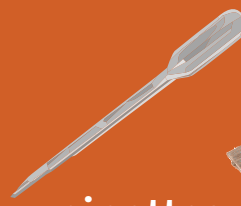
Styrofoam/polystyrene

Triple rinse container, deface, reuse with a compatible material, and add new label.
