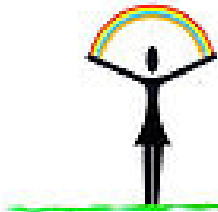


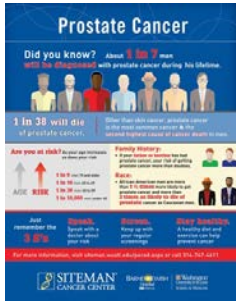


Community Partnership Spotlight: The Breakfast Club
