ACL Overview

- This new HHS Operating Division brings together the Administration on Aging (AoA), the Office on Disability (OD) and the Administration on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (AIDD)
- This single agency is charged with developing policies and improving supports for seniors and people with disabilities.

Why Is This Important?

The common interests of the aging and disability populations have been recognized at the local and state levels.

Yet at the federal level, policy development, community outreach and program implementation related to aging and disability across the lifespan was fragmented across HHS.

Investing in Economic Security


- How does this new agency support economic security for older Americans and individuals with disabilities?
- Through it's sub-agencies: the Administration on Aging & Administration on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities
- At the federal level, we fund the supports through programs, projects, and national networks that enable an older adult and/or individual with a disability to protect their income, thus reinforcing "economic security" in broad way and helping them to live fully in their community.


Investing in Economic Security


Primary ACL supports impacting economic security:


- Access Services
 - ☐ E.g. Eldercare locator, Aging & Disability Resource Centers, National Center for Benefits Outreach & Enrollment, etc.
- Supportive Services
 - ☐ E.g. transportation, nutrition programs, respite services for caregivers, etc.
- Elder Rights Services
 - ☐ Legal assistance, prevention of financial exploitation, pension counseling, etc.
- Projects of National Significance in Employment



Administration on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

Projects of National Significance

- Create and enhance opportunities for individuals with developmental disabilities to contribute to, and participate in, all facets of community life.
- Typically focus on the most pressing issues affecting individuals with developmental disabilities and their families.
- Support the development of national and state policy

Current PNS

Partnerships in Employment Systems Change Grants

- Purpose: Enhance collaboration across various state agencies to increase competitive employment for youth and young adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities.
- In eight states: Alaska, California, Iowa, Mississippi, Missouri, New York, Tennessee, Wisconsin
- The Institute for Community Inclusion (ICI) at the University of Massachusetts Boston currently serves as the Training and Technical Assistance provider for the Partnerships for Employment Systems Change grants.
