Keystone Scholars - Key Features

- First legislated state-wide universal, opt-out, at-birth CDA
- Legislation passed in 2018; program started Jan 1, 2019
- \$100 for every baby born to PA resident
- Funded by surplus earnings in the PA 529 Guaranteed Savings Plan
- Philanthropic donations for pilot and ongoing progressive subsidies

2018 Keystone Scholars Pilot

Demonstration project in 6 counties in 2018:

- Opt-in with 1 year to claim
- 19% of eligible families claimed by 12/31/19
- Families were twice as likely to open a PA 529
 account within the first year of their child's life
- Reached more diverse socioeconomic backgrounds than existing PA 529 account owners.

Key Partnerships: DATA




- Birth records file received monthly from Dept of Health
 - 3 months after birth
 - Imported directly to VistaShare
- Key data fields used include:
 - Birth File Number
 - Baby and Parent's names
 - Address, including County
 - Parents' DOB, education level, race, marital status, SSN
 - MWIC






Key Partnerships: DATA and FUNDING

Taking Child Development Accounts to Scale: Ten Key Policy Design Elements

Proposed subsidy for 2021 babies:

- \$50 additional deposit to Keystone Scholars for babies born to Mothers enrolled in WIC at time of birth
- Long-term goal: more assets for low-income children
- Short-term goal: boost awareness and test administration
- Target: double the number of Moms on WIC that register for Keystone Scholars in 1 year




