The plan should include: a description of any studies that you are currently involved with, with your mentor, and/or research areas that you intend to pursue related to HomeGrown STL, SMART Africa or the International Center for Child Health Development (ICHAD).

III. References/Letter of Recommendation - You will also be asked to provide the names of two references who will be contacted via email for Letters of Recommendation. One reference should be from your doctoral dissertation chair, a primary mentor, division supervisor, or the principal investigator on research you are conducting.

IV. Deadline - The application, supporting documents, and letters of recommendation must be received by **January 4, 2020 at 5:00 PM CST**
