## Composting with Brody

Some of the best ideas come from children. I discovered this first hand late last fall when Brody (Sun Bear) helped tend to a small evergreen tree on the playground. We talked about what the tree needs to grow and survive. Brody offered to bring in compost from his compost pile at home to help nourish the small tree. Not knowing a lot about composting, I asked Brody to tell me how the compost process works. After his elaborate and thorough description, he looked at me perplexed and asked, "Why doesn't the Nursery School compost?" I thought about it for a second and replied, "Great question, Brody. We should start composting!" That afternoon I reached out to the University's Sustainability Department to ask for their support in starting a composting program at the Nursery School. With their help, we ordered and recently received our, "Backporch Compost Tumbler". I have contacted Earthways, a sustainability/environmental group

affiliated with the Missouri Botanical Gardens to learn more about starting our composting program

and the early childhood education component. We have ordered several children's books about composting, as well as small compost buckets for each classroom to collect biodegradable items for our compost tumbler. We are just in the development stage of this new initiative, so if you have experience in composting and/or want to share your knowledge, I am open to learning. I feel lucky that my good friend Brody inspired our school community!
