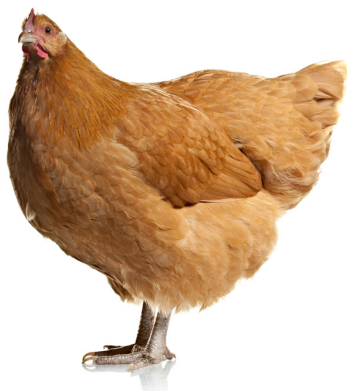
This semester we have read several chapter books from the Magic Tree House series. Check them out at your library if your child shows an interest!
