






# Hocking Plateau Landscape Plan

  - Others













#### orest Management Activity Scheduli

If property is certified in the Ohio Forest Tax Law program, the following forest management practices must be completed and procedures must be followed to remain in the program and continue to receive your reduced property tax rate.

Inspections for compliance and progress can be conducted at any time while in the program.

#### Continual Required Practices For OFTL:

- Before conducting any forestry work that is not listed in your "Forest Management Activity Summary", contact your service forester to ensure compliance with your approved Woodland Management Plan
- Do not sign any timber sale contracts or sale agreements without first informing your service forester of your intent to harvest timber.
- Boundary Marking, must be completed to the specifications outlined in the OFTL rules, and
  must be maintained at all times. Failure to maintain boundaries can lead to decertification
  from the program.
