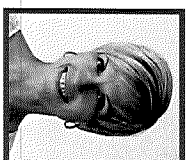


Redefining Success

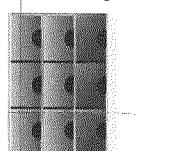

Marcy Prushing-Peirano and Kelsey Rader Crop Insurance Reducing Risk by Farm Credit Mid-America



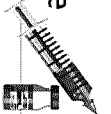

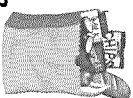
Leah Dorman Antibiotics Antibiotic Usage and Its Message
