



Important BEEF rules to follow!

KEEP PENS CLEAN! INSPECTIONS WILL BE CONDUCTED TWICE DAILY:

1st Offense = Pen tagged 1st warning "clean pen now"

2nd Offense = Pen tagged 2nd warning "clean pen now"

3rd Offense = Pen tagged 3rd & Final Warning

If pen still found in violation on the inspection following the 3rd warning, the exhibitor will not be allowed to show or sell his/her project at the fair and will not be allowed to exhibit a same project the following year at the Wayne County Fair

CLEAN AISLES NEAR YOUR PROJECT & KEEP SUPPLIES/EQUIPMENT NEAT & TIDY ALL CLUBS WILL BE ASSIGNED ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITY TO SWEEP AISLES

Clubs/FFA will have an assigned day to thoroughly sweep ALL aisles. A barn chart will be posted and brooms will be provided; be sure to return brooms!

ANIMALS ARE TO BE FED AND WATERED DAILY

WALK & RINSE ANIMALS

REMOVE ALL BUCKETS AND PANS FROM PENS AFTER FEEDING/WATERING

This keeps pens clean, pans clean, and animals safe from stepping in pans

MULCH ONLY – NO STRAW; REMOVE SOILED MULCH FROM THE PENS/BARN AND PLACE IN THE WAGONS OUTSIDE OF THE BARN

Be sure to redistribute the mulch to the front of the pens

GROOMING CHUTES:

On steer and breeding beef show days, members may bring their grooming chutes in to the barn area. Chutes must be taken home at the end of show day. During fair week, the two beef champions and the two dairy champions may leave their chutes in the barn area. Up to three more chutes (total of seven) may be brought in to the barn area; however, all beef exhibitors are to use these seven chutes throughout the week. Members wanting to bring in their own chutes for the week must get permission from the beef committee. SENIOR FAIRBOARD PROHIBITS GROOMING CHUTES, TENTS, OR OTHER EQUIPMENT NEXT TO THE BEEF BARN WHERE THE EMBANKMENT WAS REMOVED.
