Did you know that many of us in Ohio rely on private wells for our water supply? Unfortunately, some of these wells have higher levels of arsenic, which can pose health risks like cancer and heart disease.

What We're Doing:

We are conducting a community-driven study to find practical, affordable solutions to arsenic contamination in private wells.

Participation Involves:

- Piloting a treatment solution for arsenic contamination over a six-month period
- Sharing your experiences and insights through interviews and mid-point surveys
- Engaging in learning opportunities surrounding water sampling and testing procedures
- Gaining a better understanding of resources available to well-water users in your community!

- Valuable information and resources on well-water safety.
- Free water testing and a water treatment system installation.
- Play a part in research that directly benefits your community.
- Connect with neighbors and experts passionate about clean water.
