Below is a list of optional sessions that all campers will be able to choose from to further their excitement and learning at 4-H Camp. During Optional Session Day, campers will be able to attend two 1-hour sessions or one 2-hour session. Please use numbers to rank **each** session **separately** in order of preference (with 1 being first choice, 2 being second choice, and so on). While we do our best to accommodate everyone's wishes, it may be impossible for your camper to participate in the sessions that they have chosen. If we are not able to schedule your camper as requested, you will be notified at check-in and all sessions with available slots will be given to you to choose from.

Please rank your top 5 choices for Session 1

- _____ Canoe to lake and swim: **2 Hour Session.** Campers will canoe to the beach at Harrison Lake State Park and swim.
- _____ Outdoor Cooking: **2 Hour Session.** Campers will learn how to cook over an open fire making items like Hobo Packs and Campfire Desserts.
- _____ High Ropes: **2 Hour Session. Additional \$25 fee.** The Chuck Wurth High Ropes course is a wagon wheel style course that is both a challenge and an adventure. Not only will participants have a chance to try a dozen different obstacles while 30 feet in the air, but they will also bond as a team and learn about cooperation and determination. This session will end with a ride down the 240-foot zip line. This session is only available to campers aged 12 years and older and is limited to the first 15 campers. This selection must be made on page 2 of the registration form as well as on this page.
- _____ Zipline: Zip On!!! The independent zip line lets campers take a ride through the woods. Campers will work together utilizing a cargo net to get to the platform, and then it is one leap to adventure.
- _____ Crafts: Campers will create a craft with one of our Adult Volunteers that they will be able to bring home with them at the end of camp.
- _____ Creek Seining: Campers will be given a chance to explore the creek that runs through 4-H Camp Palmer and use netting and other equipment to learn about what lives in the waters of 4-H Camp Palmer.
- _____ Line Dancing: Campers will spend their time learning new line dances as well as dancing away to 4-H Camp Palmer favorites.
- _____ Atl-Atl: Learn the techniques that were used in ancient history to hunt for food. In this session, youth will learn how to use an atl-atl to throw a 6-foot dart across the big ball field.
